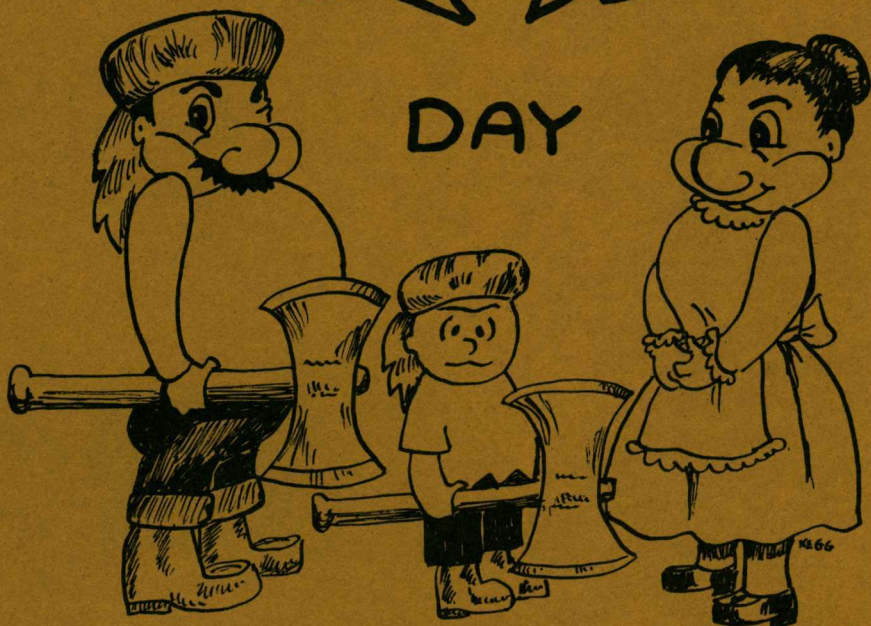

Today's Game

This Mom and Dad's Day game with Western New Mexico University Mustangs will be the 19th meeting. The series began in 1925, with the Lumberjacks having a 12-5-1 edge in the series.

Last year at Silver City, the Lumberjacks defeated the Mustangs 34 - 7.

Both teams will be trying to get back on the win road, as each suffered losses last Saturday. The Lumberjacks losing to tough Montana State College, 28-7, and Western falling to undefeated Western Colorado, 36-7. The Axers now have a 1-3-1 record with the Mustangs, a 2-4 win-loss record.

With common opponent, New Mexico Highlands, the Lumberjacks won 49-0, while the Mustangs dropped Highlands 21-6. On paper, this gives the Lumberjacks the favored role, but Coach Spilsbury says the scouting reports indicates that Western has one of their best teams in years, and anything can happen in today's game.

Two Axer starters, guard Chuck Harvell and halfback Jim Russo, will probably see little or no action in today's game. Harvell came down with a strep throat early this week, and Russo re-injured his ankle last Saturday in the Montana State College game. With Harvell and Russo sidelined, Coach Spilsbury has had eight starters out of the lineup at various times during the season. Halfback Jim Sims, hurt in the Axer's homecoming game, has missed two games, but is ready for duty against the Mustangs.

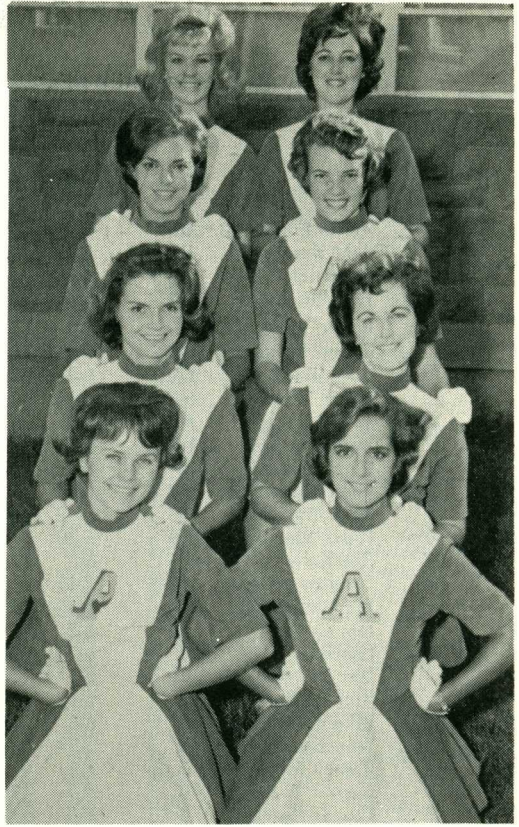

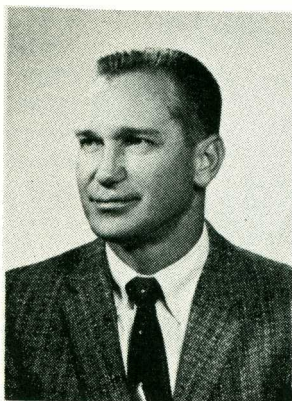

Next week the Lumberjacks make their final home appearance, meeting one of their keenest rivals, the Cal Poly Broncos from Pomona, California. Game time is set for 8 p.m.

Since 1935, the Lumberjacks have played Cal Poly seven times, and the Broncos have won three games to the Axers two, and two games have been tied. The Broncos have defeated the Lumberjacks in the last three games. The last win for the Lumberjacks was in 1958 when they won, 16-8. Last year at Pomona, the Broncos shut out the Lumberjacks, 38-0.

This year the Broncos are facing a rebuilding year, and since their opening win, 35-6 over Sacramento State, have gone down to defeat in four straight games. Last Saturday, they fell to the undefeated Marines, 36-6. Early in the season the Marines downed the Lumberjacks 40-7.

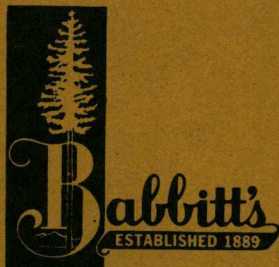
