

## Tonight's Game

It will be another tough one for the Lumberjacks tonight against the San Diego Marines' Devildogs, and it should be an exciting game.

The Devildogs are undefeated in their two game this season. They won their opener against the University of Mexico, 42-0, and then last Saturday, Sept. 21, led by their fleet-footed halfback, Cleveland Jones, 5-4, 155-pounder; and break-away halfback Kelton Winston, 6-0, 210 pounds, fullback Perry Rodrique, 5-8, 195; dropped Long Beach State, 23-14.

In the only encounter with the San Diego Marines back in '58,

the Lumberjacks came out on top, 25-19.

In going up against the Devildogs, the Lumberjacks will be outweighed in both line and in the backfield. On the line the Marines will have a 22-pound edge with an average of 233 to 211 pounds for the Lumberjacks. In the backfield the Marines average 192-pounds to the Lumberjack's 187-pound average.

Last season the Marines had an 8-2 win-loss record, and this year have an experienced squad made up of many college-

experienced players and pro-draft choices.

Axer halfback, David Estrada, picked up where he left off last season when he was injured, by picking up 75 yards in 17 carries in last Saturday's 6-6 tie with Whittier. With first-game jitters out of the way, Coach Spilsbury expects the Axer offensive to show a lot more power tonight. In last week's game Spilsbury indicated that offensive blocking was not what it should be, but should show improvement in tonight's game.

### LOGGER COACHES



HEAD COACH MAX SPILSBURY -- Since taking over as coach of the Arizona State College Lumber-jacks, Coach Spilsbury has compiled an enviable record of 48 wins, 18 losses, and 4 ties. In those seven years he has had only one losing season. This past season the Lumberjacks finished with a 6-4-0 record.

A 1950 graduate from the University of Arizona, Spilsbury played end on the Wildcat football team. Prior to joining ASC, he was line coach for the U of A Wildcats.

He also coached high school football for five years and compiled a record of 31 wins, 13 losses, and 4 ties to give him a lifetime coaching record of 79 wins, 31 losses, and only 8 tie-games.

LINE COACH KEN GIBLER -- This is Coach Gibler's second year as a member of the Lumberjack coaching staff. Before coming to ASC he had five years experience coaching football at Blue Springs, Mo. High School, where he compiled a record of 27-18-4.

A 1957 graduate of Missouri Valley College, where he played end for four years and played in the Tangerine and Mineral Bowls. In his senior year, he was team co-captain, and was named to the Williamson All-American first team. He also played service ball for the Air Force and was named to the All-United Kingdom first team.





ASSISTANT COACH ED VAN WINKLE -- A new-comer to the coaching staff this year, Coach Van Winkle is handling the defensive backs and linebackers. Prior to coming to ASC, he was on the coaching staff at Ajo High School as assistant football coach and head basketball coach.

A 1955 graduate of ASC, Van Winkle was an outstanding quarterback for the Lumberjacks for three years, and also earned three varsity letters in basketball.


