

We hope that you will enjoy the special events and will return on other occasions to visit our campus.





Today's Game

The game between the Lumberjacks and the Indians of Adams State College is the final home appearance for the Lumberjacks this season. Two more game remain on the Lumberjack schedule, Nov. 14, Eastern New Mexico University at Portales, and Nov. 21, University of Santa Clara at Santa Clara, Calif. Nine seniors make their last home

appearance today.

Going into today's game the Lumberjacks boast a 5-1, winloss record. Adams State has a 4-2, win-loss record. The Lumberjacks have won nine of their last 10 games. The only loss this year was a tight one, 10-9 to Arlington State College. So far this season the Lumberjacks have a scoring average of 29.0 points per game, while holding their opponents to 9.3 points per game. Rushing average for the season is 344.1 yards to their opponents 93.0 yards per game.

Leading rusher for the Lumberjacks is fleet-footed senior halfback Jim Sims of Tucson, who is averaging 109.7 yards per game. Following Sims is hard-running senior halfback David Estrada with a six-game average of 82.2 yards per game. In last week's 56-6 win over New Mexico Western, Sims set a new college record in rushing when he carried

the ball 14 times for a total of 306 yards.

This week the Lumberjacks hit the top ten in National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics rankings, with 8th place standing. United Press-International's small college poll this week ranked the Lumberjacks 14th among the nation's small colleges.

LOGGER COACHES



HEAD COACH MAX SPILSBURY -- This season marks the ninth year for Coach Spilsbury as head football coach of the Arizona State College Lumberjacks. In his eight seasons at ASC, Spilsbury has compiled an outstanding record with 53 wins, 21 losses, and 5 ties. Last year the Lumberjacks finished with a 5-3-1 record.

He graduated from the University of Arizona in 1950, where he was an outstanding end. Just prior to taking over as head football coach at ASC, he was line coach at the University.

Before going into college coaching, Coach Spilsbury spent five years coaching high schoolfootball and compiled a prep coaching record of 31 wins, 13 losses and 4 ties. His lifetime coaching record now stands at 84 wins, 34 losses, and 9 tie-games.

LINE COACH KEN GIBLER -- This is Gibler's third season as line coach for the ASC Lumberjack football team. As a high school coach at Blue Springs, Mo. for five years before coming to ASC, he compiled a record of 27 wins, 18 losses, and 4 ties.

Gibler played collegiate football at Missouri Valley College, and was an outstanding end. He graduated from there in 1957, and was co-captain of the team his senior year. He was a member of the Missouri Valley team that played in the Tangerine and Mineral Bowls. Also during his senior year, he was named to the Williamson All-American first team.

While in the U.S. Air Force he played service ball, and was named to the All-United Kingdom first team.



LOGGER COACHES

END COACH LEO HABERLACK -- A new-comer to the coaching staff this fall, Haberlack was assistant coach at Minot State College, N. Dakota for the past two years. A graduate of Minot State, he earned four letters in football and named to the NDIAC All-Conference squad.

Haberlack earned three letters in track. He also played service ball with the U.S. Army. Before joining Minot State coaching staff, he coached high school ball, wrestling, and track at Harvey, N.D., and Minot High.

At ASC he will be head track coach and assistant in wrestling.





BACKFIELD COACH BRADLYNN -- Also a newcomer to the ASC coaching staff this year is Brad Lynn. Lynn, assistant professor of police science, was backfield coach at Notre Dame for the past five years, where he also played football.

His collegiate coaching also included Backfield coach at University of San Francisco for four years and 1 year at Cabrillo JC, Calif. He coached three years at Santa Cruz, Calif., High, where he compiled at 23-7, win-loss record.

Lynn is a graduate of Arizona State University, where he played one year of football. He has his MA in police science from Indiana University.





AXER KICKING SPECIALIST -- "Automatic" Monte Harris, 6-1, 205-pound senior from Holbrook, Ariz., is the second-leading scorer for the Arizona State College Lumberjacks this season with a five-game total of 31 points—all on kicking. This season he has kicked 25 of 27 PATs (18 straight) and has kicked two of five field goal attempts, one for 42 yards and the other for 33 yards. A powerful place kicker, his kick-offs go into the end zone better than 90% of the time. His field goals usually end up outside the track surrounding the field. To date (five games this season) he has 67 of 79 PATs, scored four field goals and three TDs.
