Tonight's Game

It'll be a tough one tonight against the Arlington State (Texas) Rebels. Last Saturday night, while the Lumberjacks romped over Weber State, 41-6, the Rebels lost a heart-breaker, 0-3, to New Mexico State University. It was in the last 15 seconds of the ball-game when New Mexico scored their 36-yard field goal.

As Coach Max Spilsbury puts it, "Anyone that can hold a Warren Woodson team like Arlington State did, they're bound to be tough." The Rebels are big and fast both offensively and defensively. They have two complete teams, that are equally good.

Instead of the free substitution of last week's game, the Lumberjacks will be playing tonight's game under NCAA rules which permit liberal substitution only when the ball is dead and during time outs.

The Axers' rushing game and passing game which clicked so well in the season's opener should get a real test tonight. Offensively the Lumberjacks will be outweighed on the line by an average of six pounds per man.

The Rebels have an outstanding punter, Al Smith, who averaged 43 yards per kick. The long boots and the fast line stopped any punt return threats of the NM Aggies.

Both teams are expected to be in top physical shape, so tonight's game should prove to be an exciting one.

NEXT WEEK

Next week the Lumberjacks take to the road in the first of five road trips. They travel to Pocatello, Idaho, for their eighth meeting with the always strong Idaho State University Bengals. This will be an afternoon game. This makes the second straight tough one for the Axers. If their 30-0 win over Omaha U last Saturday is any indication, the Bengals seem to be on their way again. They are defending champions of the Big Sky Conference. Idaho State have a 5-2, win-loss edge in the series with the Lumberjacks. Last year they spoiled the Lumberjacks Homecoming, 13-2.

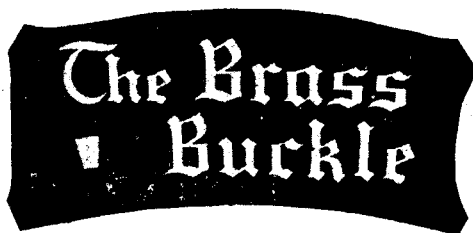

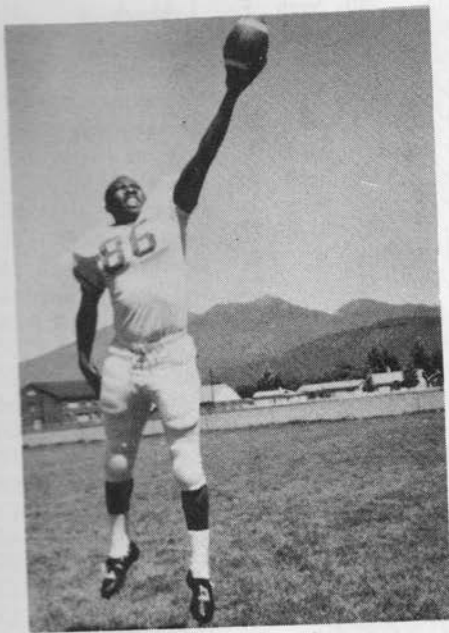

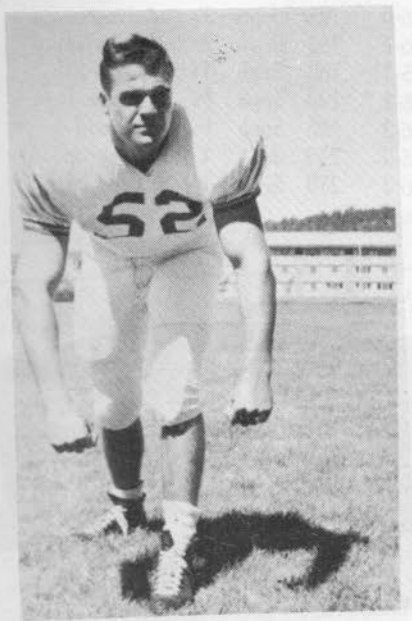
