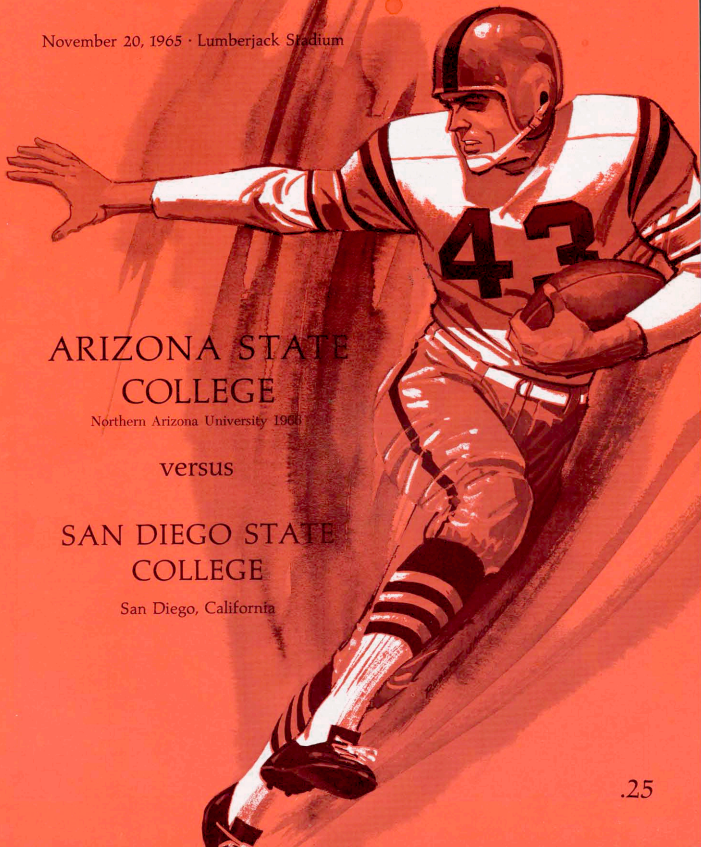

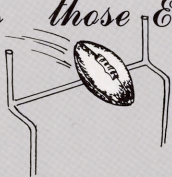

DR. TED KECK
Director of Athletics



ANDY MacDONALD
Head Football Coach

HEAD COACH ANDY MACDONALD took over the duties as new head coach of the Lumberjacks during spring ball.

Prior to taking the head coaching job at ASC, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter under Jerry Burns at the State University of Iowa for four years. Before joining the Iowa staff, he coached nine years at Flint (Mich.) Northern High School. As head coach at Flint Northern, MacDonald's 1956 and 1960 teams were state champions, and he was named Coach of the Year both years.

He played collegiate ball at Central Michigan University where he was named on the "Little All-America" as quarterback, and was the leading small college passer in the nation for two years, 1950 and 1951.

DR. TED KECK, Director of Athletics and Physical Education, is in his third year at Arizona State College. He came to ASC from Minot State College, Minot, N.D.

Dr. Keck is a veteran coach. For seven years he coached baseball at Minot State, and in 1962, his team was in the NAIA national tournament. He was also head football coach at Minot State from 1954 through '56, and his '54 team won the NDIAC football championship.

KEN GIBLER is in his fourth season on the Lumberjack coaching staff. Prior to joining the ASC staff, he coached football at Blue Springs, Mo., High, where he compiled a record of 27 wins, 18 losses and four ties. Gibler played collegiate ball at Missouri Valley College where he was an outstanding end.

BILL ODYKIRK is a newcomer this year to the Lumberjack coaching staff. Last year he was freshman coach and head of the recruiting program at Central Michigan University, where he played collegiate football. Prior to joining the Central Michigan staff, he coached high school ball.

GRADUATE ASSISTANT this year is Owen Dejanovich, an outstanding Lumberjack lineman on the 1962-63 squads. He transferred to ASC from Thornton, Ill., JC where he made JC All-America for two years straight.

FRESHMAN COACH LEO HABERLACK. This is his second season on the ASC coaching staff. He is also head track coach. Prior to coming to ASC, Haberlack was assistant coach at Minot State College, N.D.

HEAD TRAINER BILL KAUTH is another newcomer to the Lumberjack athletic staff. He earned his M.S. degree in physical education at Indiana State University.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH Don Coryell, since his arrival in 1961 at San Diego State, has an outstanding record of 30 wins, eight losses and one tie. Since his arrival, San Diego Aztec football teams have enjoyed success unmatched in 42 years of the sport.

His record as a head coach at four-year institutions is 52 wins, 11 losses and two ties.

Following his graduation from the University of Washington in 1950, where he played defensive halfback for two seasons, Coryell remained another year and obtained a Master of Arts degree in 1951.

His first coaching assignment took him to Honolulu where he was an assistant at Punahou Academy, and the following year he became head coach at Farrington High in Honolulu. In 1953, Coryell was named head coach at the University of British Columbia and stayed there two seasons before taking the head coaching job at Wenatchee JC in Washington. At Wenatchee, his team won the state title and played in the Potato Bowl in 1955.

Coryell then coached at Fort Ord for a season before taking over the head coaching job at Whittier College where the Poets compiled a 22-3-1 record. In 1960, he took the position as backfield coach at the University of Southern California.

TODAY'S GAME

San Diego State, like Arlington State, will be one of the toughest opponents on the Lumberjack schedule, and it also closes out the 1965 season.

The Aztecs, 6-2 for the season, won their third straight with a 51-0 shellacking of San Fernando Valley State last Saturday. The Lumberjacks took their second win in a row last Saturday, with a 41-14 victory over Eastern New Mexico to boost their record to 5-3-1.

Lumberjack fans will again see a team that is noted for a strong passing offense as well as a powerful running game, led by All-America end Gary Garrison who has caught 48 passes for eight TDs, flanker Craig Scoggins, who is not far behind Garrison with nearly 40 passes and seven TDs, and quarterback Don Horn. Up until Saturday's game Horn had completed 94 of 154 passes and 15 TDs. Last Saturday he played a big part in the 12 of 25 completions for seven TDs in the 51-0 win.

The Aztecs have a strong rushing offense in the one-two running combination of tailbacks Don Shy and Nate Johns. Johns is currently averaging 7.9 yards per carry, while Shy follows with 6.2.

The Lumberjack defense will have their work cut out for them today. Through nine games the Lumberjack defense has held opponents to an average of 93.1 yards rushing and 112.9 yards passing, while the offense is averaging 181.8 yards on the ground and 115.4 yards by passing.

Playing their final game today for the Lumberjacks are co-captains Bill Shorty and Gary Campbell, center Bob Krizan, quarterback Larry Welsh and guard Erv Rodgers.
