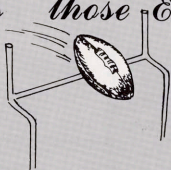

DR. TED KECK
Director of Athletics



ANDY MacDONALD
Head Football Coach

HEAD COACH ANDY MACDONALD took over the duties as new head coach of the Lumberjacks during spring ball.

Prior to taking the head coaching job at ASC, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter under Jerry Burns at the State University of Iowa for four years. Before joining the Iowa staff, he coached nine years at Flint (Mich.) Northern High School. As head coach at Flint Northern, MacDonald's 1956 and 1960 teams were state champions, and he was named Coach of the Year both years.

He played collegiate ball at Central Michigan University where he was named on the "Little All-America" as quarterback, and was the leading small college passer in the nation for two years, 1950 and 1951. In addition he was named on the all-conference team for two straight years, and voted most valuable player at Central Michigan.

MacDonald received his B.S. in Education at Central Michigan and his M.A. in Education at Eastern Michigan University. Andy and his wife Dolly have three children, Laurie Lee, 11; Patti Sue, 9; and Anne Drew, 5.

DR. TED KECK, Director of Athletics and Physical Education, is in his third year at Arizona State College. He came to ASC from Minot State College, Minot, N.D., where he held a similar position for 14 years.

He received his B.S. degree from Minot State, and earned his M.S. and Ed.D. degrees at the University of Oregon.

Dr. Keck is a veteran coach. For seven years he coached baseball at Minot State, and in 1962, his team was in the NAIA national tournament. He was also head football coach at Minot State from 1954 through '56, and his '54 team won the NDIAC football championship. His baseball team also dominated the North Dakota conference.

TODAY'S GAME

In today's annual Mom and Dad's Day game, the ASC Lumberjacks meet another unpredictable rival, the California Polytechnic Broncos from Pomona, Calif. Since 1958, an intense rivalry between the Lumberjacks and the Broncos has developed. In the eight game series, the Lumberjacks have won four, while losing three and tying one game.

The Broncos, with 14 returning lettermen, opened the season with a 7-3 win over Whittier (who edged the Lumberjacks, 3-2). They lost the

BRONCOS COACH

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH and Coordinator of Athletics is Don Warhurst. In eight years as head coach at California State Polytechnic at Pomona, Warhurst has compiled an impressive 47-23-2 record. The 1962 season was his high mark, with the Broncos winning 9 and losing 1 and earned a 13th national ranking among small college teams. Last year's record of 1-6 was only the second time he has experienced a losing season at Cal Poly.

Warhurst is a 1943 graduate of University of California, and coached at Piedmont, Santa Ana and Modesto high school, and at San Bernardino Valley College, before going to Cal Poly at Pomona.

next two games 33-6 and 41-0 to strong Long Beach State and Los Angeles State. Last Saturday, they came back to take a 34-14 win over Sacramento State.

The Lumberjacks had a defensive battle with Idaho State University last Saturday in the annual Homecoming game, to finish with a 0-0 tie, for a 1-2-1 record. Since the opening loss of 21-14 to Weber State, the ASC Lumberjacks have not permitted a touchdown while scoring 10 touchdowns.

In today's game, Lumberjack fans will have an opportunity to watch a wide-open game, as both the Lumberjacks and the Broncos throw a lot of passes in addition to their rushing game.

Statistical leaders for the Lumberjacks for four games are senior quarterback Larry Welsh, who is averaging 87.0 yards per game in total offense (passing and rushing), and freshman fullback Don Mylchrest, who is averaging 44.2 yards in rushing. Welsh has completed 26 of 63 passes for a total of 345 yards and five TD's. Sophomore halfback Tom Foster is averaging 42.3 yards per punt, and sophomore end Bill Hanna has snagged five passes for one TD. End Fritz Kreuzer has a total of four passes for 90 yards, and Foster has scored two TD's on his four catches.

Both in rushing and passing the Lumberjacks have the edge on their opponents, 157.0 to 100.5 and 103.5 to 75.2 yards, respectively.
