DR. TED KECK
Director of Athletics



ANDY MACDONALD
Head Coach

Under a new banner, Northern Arizona University, Coach Andy MacDonald is at the helm for his second year. Last year coming in late for spring ball, he finished with a respectable 5-4-1 record.

Before taking over as head coach at NAU, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter at State University of Iowa for four years. Prior to moving to Iowa, he coached nine years at Flint Northern High, Mich.

A veteran coach, Dr. Ted Keck is in his fourth year as director of athletics and physical education at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State in North Dakota.

At Minot State he coached football and baseball. In 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship. During his seven year's tenure as baseball coach, his team dominated the conference and in 1962 his team was in the NAIA national tournament.



KEN GIBLER is a four-year veteran of the NAU Lumberjack coaching staff. He coached football at Blue Springs, Mo., High before joining NAU. He played collegiate ball at Missouri Valley.



OWEN DEJANOVICH, a graduate assistant last year, was appointed assistant coach last spring. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962 and '63 Lumberjack squads.



LEO HABERLACK is starting his third season as junior varsity coach. He also doubles as track coach. He came to NAU from Minot State College, N. D. where he was a member of the coaching staff.



BILL KAUTH, head trainer, is starting his second year as full-time trainer in the NAU athletic department. He was assistant trainer at Indiana State University while earning his M.S. degree.

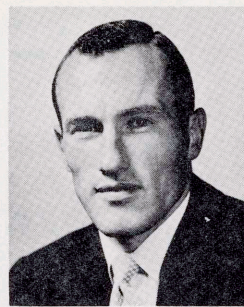

HUGH DAVIDSON
Head Coach



DR. W. SCHWANK
Athletic Director

HUGH DAVIDSON, a former Colorado University grid star, guided the Grizzlies to a 4-6 record last year. Before taking over the helm of the Grizzlies he was a highly touted backfield coach at U. of M. for six years.

Davidson is considered one of the top defensive coaches in the nation. In 1960, the Davidson coached secondary ranked second in the nation in pass defense. In 1961, he was featured speaker at the American Football Coaches convention. He was one of two U.S. coaches chosen to help conduct a series of clinics for the Air Force and Army coaches and officials four years ago.

DR. WALLY SCHWANK assumed duties as athletic director at University of Montana in July of 1961. He played an instrumental role in the foundation of the Big Sky Conference.

A 1934 graduate of Coe College, Iowa, Schwank received his M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Iowa. He also taught and coached at Iowa.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Against the University of Montana, the NAU Lumberjacks will be going up against a team that not only runs a lot, but also uses the passing game effectively enough to keep opponents "hon-est" and on its toes.

Montana has also been noted for its strong defensive play, and tonight's game should test it with such strong Lumberjack ball carriers as "Nimble" Dalton Kimball and Big George Herman, along with fleet-footed pass-catching ace Sim Stokes.

On the other hand the Montana Grizzlies will undoubtedly test the strong Lumberjack defense, "Andy's Rustlers," which has held opponents to an average of 64.2 yards rushing and intercepted 14 passes in the last four games. In the 32-12 upset over nationally ranked Long Beach State, the "Rustlers" roped eight passes, two of them accounting for TDs just 12 seconds apart.

The Lumberjacks could have their hands full with the Grizzlies speedy wingback Willie Jones, a :09.5 sprinter, and quarterback John Vaccarelli, a good runner in addition to a passing threat.

Montana's 1-5 record is not indicative of its strength. They have been known to upset the best of them.

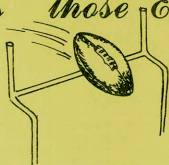
