ANDY MacDONALD
Head Coach

Under a new banner, Northern Arizona University, Coach Andy MacDonalD is at the helm for his second year. Last year coming in late for spring ball, he finished with a respectable 5-4-1 record.

Before taking over as head coach at NAU, MacDonalD was backfield coach and chief recruiter at State University of Iowa for four years. Prior to moving to Iowa, he coached nine years at Flint Northern High, Mich.

A veteran coach, Dr. Ted Keck is in his fourth year as director of athletics and physical education at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State in North Dakota.

At Minot State he coached football and baseball. In 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship. During his seven year's tenure as baseball coach, his team dominated the conference and in 1962 his team was in the NAIA national tournament.



KEN GIBLER is a four-year veteran on the NAU Lumberjack coaching staff. He coached football at Blue Springs, Mo., High before joining NAU. He played collegiate ball at Missouri Valley.



OWEN DEJANOVICH, a graduate assistant last year, was appointed assistant coach last spring. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962 and '63 Lumberjack squads.



LEO HABERLACK is starting his third season as junior varsity coach. He also doubles as track coach. He came to NAU from Minot State College, N. D. where he was a member of the coaching staff.



BILL KAUTH, head trainer, is starting his second year as full-time trainer in the NAU athletic department. He was assistant trainer at Indiana State University while earning his M.S. degree.

Reed K. Swenson has been associated with athletics at Weber State College since 1933. During his tenure as coach and athletic director, Dr. Swenson served 13 consecutive years as president of the National Junior College Athletic Association. ("Doc" became one of the nation's finest junior college basketball coaches in the years between 1933 and 1957.)

As head of the physical education department and athletic director of Weber State College, Dr. Swenson was instrumental in the formation of the Big Sky Athletic Conference and the admission of Weber State into the new league.

Coach Sark Arslanian is a winner! Prior to coming to Weber State in 1965, Arslanian established a remarkable coaching record at Dixie Junior College. In nine years his teams won 64 games, lost 26, and tied three.

Sark's winning ways continue at Weber State. In 1965, the Wildcats won eight of nine games, captured a share of the Big Sky Conference crown, and earned fifth place national college division ranking.

TONIGHT'S GAME

It's the season's opener for both the Lumberjacks and the Weber State Wildcats, and both probably have season-opening "jitters."

The Wildcats are defending Big Sky co-champs, and are looking forward to repeat in the title chase and to improve on last year's fifth place national college ranking. Coach Stark Arslanian has 28 returning lettermen including seven who were named on the all-conference first team or on the Associated Press first team.

Among the outstanding Wildcat returnees are fleet-footed, all-conference tailback Henry Owens and second-team all-conference fullback Lee White.

Coach Andy MacDonald feels the lumberjacks are 100% improved over last year, but also the schedule is "beefed up."

Tonight, Lumberjack fans can expect to see a wide-open game with an improved Lumberjack passing offense and a rushing game that includes speed and power.



VETERAN LUMBERJACK ANNOUNCER

Andy Wolf, Flagstaff businessman, begins his 26th year as announcer for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjacks. In 1935 and '36, Andy made All-Border Conference and was captain of the Lumberjacks in 1936. A three-year letterman, Andy played offensive guard and defensive tackle under Mark McIntosh and Garret Arbelbide. In addition to announcing all Lumberjack football games, he has announced the All-Star games since they originated. He also announced the Kiwanis sponsored Salad Bowl games held in Phoenix a number of years ago.
