## Axers Whip Poets, 46-29

WHITTIER, Calif.-Courage was the name of the game yesterday as Northern Arizona's Lumberjacks blew Whittier's Poets from a smog-filled stadium with a 34-point second half to whip the Californians, 46-29.

Twice trailing by two-touchdown margins, the favored Axers got clutch plays from sophomore tight end Sonny Campbell, whose alertness and pass receiving gave NAU the go-ahead points. The Lumberjacks trailed 20-12 at the half and Whittier grabbed a 14-point advantage early in the third quarter when Pat Ferguson hit Ross Stewart with a 14-yard touchdown pass.

THAT SEEMED TO TRIGGER the Lumberjacks who went on to outscore Whittier in the second half, 34-9.

Campbell got the Axers going when he grabbed a deflected pass for an 18-yard touchdown play. And Rich O'Hara, who caught three passes during that 70yard drive, got the two-point conversion on a pass from Ted James.

Behind, 26-20, with 4:40 to go in the third quarter, NAU scored behind the running of Chick Harris and Gary Barnes. The latter, a senior fullback, went in from the five-yard line to tie the game, 26-all.

BILL HANNA MISSED THE extra point kick and it appeared to be fatal for NAU, especially after soccer-style kicker Bob Stillwagon booted a 36-yard field goal to give Whittier a 29-26 edge at the end of three quarters.

But the Axers weren't finished by a long way as they punched home 20 points in the final 15 minutes. The go-ahead touchdown was set up when Campbell made a fingertip catch of a Jim Velasquez pass for a 28-yard gain to Whittier's five.

It took NAU four down to get the score. Harris went inside left tackle for the touchdown that gave NAU the lead for good.

TWO MINUTES later, after the Lumberjack's de-

fensive line held firmly, NAU's Bruce Branstrom took a Whittier punt on his own 45 and raced the distance behind a wall of blockers. NAU's defense, once the big comeback was engineered by the offense, limited Whittier to only two first downs in the final quarter.

Leading that defensive charge were Bud Weidoff, Larry Small and Ernie Redmond.

The Lumberjack offense, that stalled badly in the first half, continued to function well up to the final gun. O'Hara took an 8-yard pass from James in the final five seconds of play.

NAU'S FIRST two touchdowns were credited almost entirely to the defensive unit. Five plays after 263pound Don Sam recovered a Whittier fumble on the Poet 26, James scored from the two. The touchdown was set up on a James-to-Campbell pass for 19 yards.

With 15 seconds left in the first quarter, NAU's defenseive end Bud Lane intercepted a pass and went 35 vards for the touchdown.
