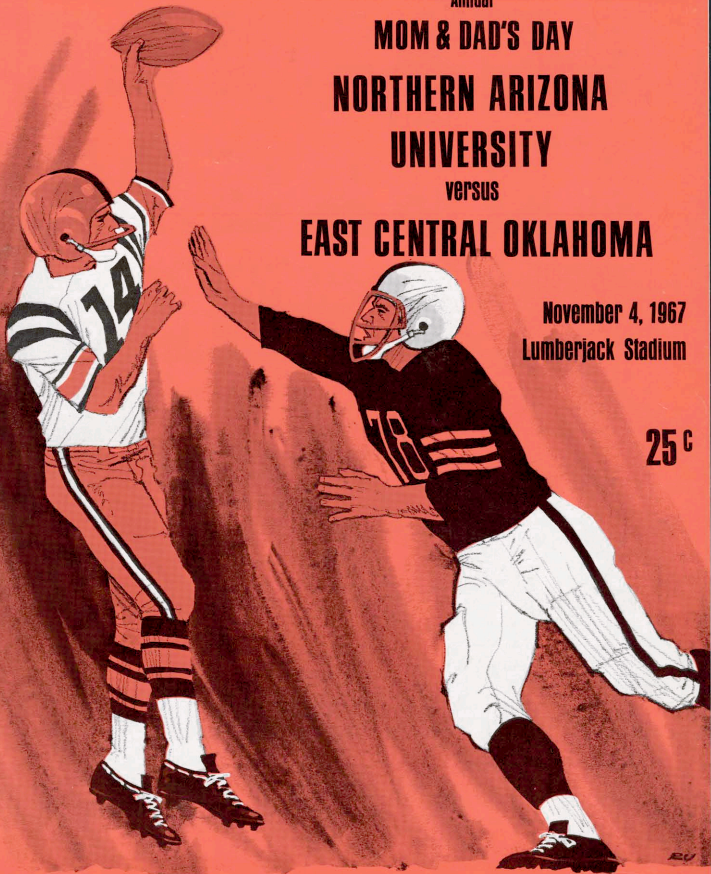

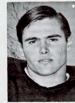

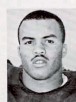

ANDY MACDONALD
Head Coach



DR. TED KECK
Director of Athletics

This year might well be called COACH ANDY MacDONALD'S "harvest year," as it is the culmination of his recruiting efforts over the past two-and-a-half years since taking over in the spring of 1965. He expects to have his best team since his arrival here.

Before taking over as head coach at NAU, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter at State University of Iowa. He coached nine years at Flint Northern High School in Michigan before joining the staff at Iowa.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR TED KECK is a five-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship. He also coached baseball, and during his seven year's tenure as baseball coach, his teams dominated the conference.



OWEN DEJANOVICH begins his second year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.

GLEN RIGGERT is a newcomer to the Lumberjack coaching staff. This spring he finished his M.A. degree at Utah State, where he assisted Tony Knap last year.

Riggert played collegiate ball at Fresno State under Cecil Coleman, and was a member of the undefeated Fresno State team which played in the Mercy Bowl in 1961.

BILL KAUTH is a two-year veteran as head trainer for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjack athletic teams. He received his M.S. degree in physical education at Indiana State University where he also served as assistant trainer.

Head Coach and Athletic Director

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AND ATHLETIC DIRECTOR — Elvan George has been head coach and AD at East Central State College at Ada, Okla., since January, 1959 after a successful tenure as coach at Ada High School. George graduated from Center College, Ky., in 1935. He earned his M.S. degree at Oklahoma State in 1940. Since 1959, he has compiled an enviable record of 62 wins, 21 losses, and only three ties. Currently the Tigers are well on their way to their fourth straight conference title.

He has been named to the Oklahoma Football Hall of Fame, and has authored two books — "Split-T in High School Football" and "Weight Training for Football." Twice he has been named Oklahoma Coach of the Year.

TODAY'S GAME

Even though out-weighted by the Lumberjacks by a big margin, the East Central Tigers are a team that can pass and run with the best of them. They are extremely quick and fast. Their defense has been extremely tough this season — not because of size, but due to mobility.

Since losing their first game 27-14 to Stephen Austin, the Tigers have downed six straight opponents — all conference games — to pretty well assure themselves of their fourth straight Oklahoma Collegiate Conference title.

The Lumberjacks, on the other hand, hope to recuperate from last week's 10-7 loss to the University of Montana. Not only was it a heartbreaking loss, but three starters — flanker Rich O'Hara, split end Jim Fuller and tight end Sonny Campbell were injured. It is possible they will see only limited action today. Last week O'Hara tied the one-season pass reception of 37 set by Sim Stokes last year. If he sees action today, he could break the pass receiving yardage for a season of 601 yards set by Al Rex in 1958.
