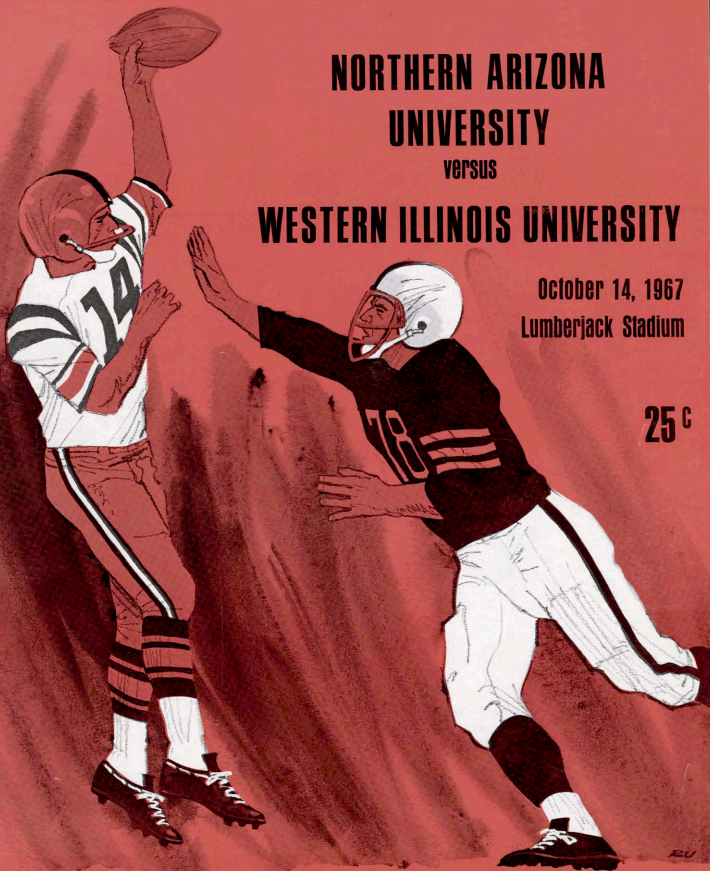

ANDY MacDONALD
Head Coach



DR. TED KECK
Director of Athletics

This year might well be called COACH ANDY MacDONALD'S "harvest year," as it is the culmination of his recruiting efforts over the past two-and-a-half years since taking over in the spring of 1965. He expects to have his best team since his arrival here.

Before taking over as head coach at NAU, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter at State University of Iowa. He coached nine years at Flint Northern High School in Michigan before joining the staff at Iowa.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR TED KECK is a five-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAAC championship. He also coached baseball, and during his seven year's tenure as baseball coach, his teams dominated the conference.



OWEN DEJANOVICH begins his second year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football team. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.

GLEN RIGGERT is a newcomer to the Lumberjack coaching staff. This spring he finished his M.A. degree at Utah State, where he assisted Tony Knap last year.

Riggert played collegiate ball at Fresno State under Cecil Coleman, and was a member of the undefeated Fresno State team which played in the Mercy Bowl in 1961.

BILL KAUTH is a two-year veteran as head trainer for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjack athletic teams. He received his M.S. degree in physical education at Indiana State University where he also served as assistant trainer.

ART DUFELEMEIER
Head Coach



DR. HARRY FRITZ
Director of Athletics

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH ART DUFELEMEIER became head football coach at Western Illinois in 1960, succeeding Lou Saban, coach of the Boston Patriots.

Dufelmeier starred for the University of Illinois in 1946 when they won the Big Ten and Rose Bowl titles. He had a crack at pro football, signing with the San Francisco '49ers, but an ankle injury forced him to discontinue pro ball.

He has directed Western Illinois to a 33-26-1 record since 1960.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR — DR. HARRY FRITZ has been director of athletics at Western Illinois since 1964 following 10 years at Bemidji State in Minnesota as director of athletics and chairman of the Division of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

In addition to his duties as director of athletics, Dr. Fritz is dean of Western's new School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

TODAY'S GAME

For the second straight Saturday, the Lumberjacks, somewhat riddled with injuries to key players, will face a team that can explode all of a sudden, especially with a potent passing attack. Information from Western Illinois points out that even though the Leathernecks have lost the first three games, they could respond with a well-knit unit that could surprise the Lumberjacks.

Last week, the Lumberjack offense charged out in the second half like a grizzly bear protecting its cubs at the entrance of a cave. They riddled the Omaha University defense with a display of hard blocking and running and effective passing to score 20 points in the third quarter and 14 points in the final period to take a 41-13 homecoming win and a 3-2 win-loss record. Two weeks ago at Whittier, the Lumberjacks exploded in the second half for 34 points and a 46-29 win.

Both the Leathernecks and the Lumberjacks are suffering from key injuries. The Lumberjacks were hit with the illness of defensive specialist Chick Harris and linebacker Ernie Redmond to bring the toll to five regulars on the sidelines. The Leathernecks, according to information received, have nine regulars sidelined.

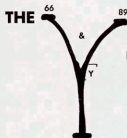
