# OPPONENTS TO WATCH



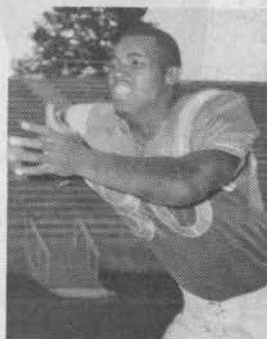
**LEADING RUSHER** for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjacks is sophomore tailback Chris "Thunder" Thornton with a total of 442 yards in 81 attempts for a 5.2 yards per carry in four games. He sat out one game for disciplinary purposes but came back in the Omaha game to pace the Lumberjack's 41-13 win with a total of 163 yards in 20 carries and three TDs. Thornton, from Wellesville, Ohio, was considered one of the top prep stars in Ohio before coming to Arizona.

**SPEEDSTER** Chick Harris, a junior from Long Beach, plays a dual role with the Northern Arizona University Lumberjacks. His speed makes him an invaluable defensive back, and he can handle the tailback spot with the best of them. Currently he is averaging 4.5 yards per carry.



**SENIOR QUARTERBACK** Jim Valesquez of Santa Barbara JC is total offense leader for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjacks. He has a total of 480 yards in 87 plays, and has connected with 32 passes in 70 attempts for 450 yards and three TDs. He is also a good scrambler.

**TIGHT END** Sonny Campbell, 6-0, 185-pound sophomore from Rillito, Ariz., has moved into a starting role with his spectacular play in the last couple of games. His blocking has been terrific, and he has come through with some clutch pass receiving to pull the Lumberjacks ahead. He took over the extra point kicking when Bill Hanna was injured and in last Saturday's 41-13 win over Omaha U, he put five of six through the uprights.



**LEADING PASS RECEIVER** for the NAU Lumberjacks is 6-3, 210-pound flanker Rich O'Hara, a senior transfer from University of Iowa. O'Hara has snagged 23 passes for a total of 357 yards and three TDs. He's NAU's top candidate for All-American honors this year. His blocking this year has been tops, and when he catches a pass he can make like a gazelle dodging the attack of a lion.
