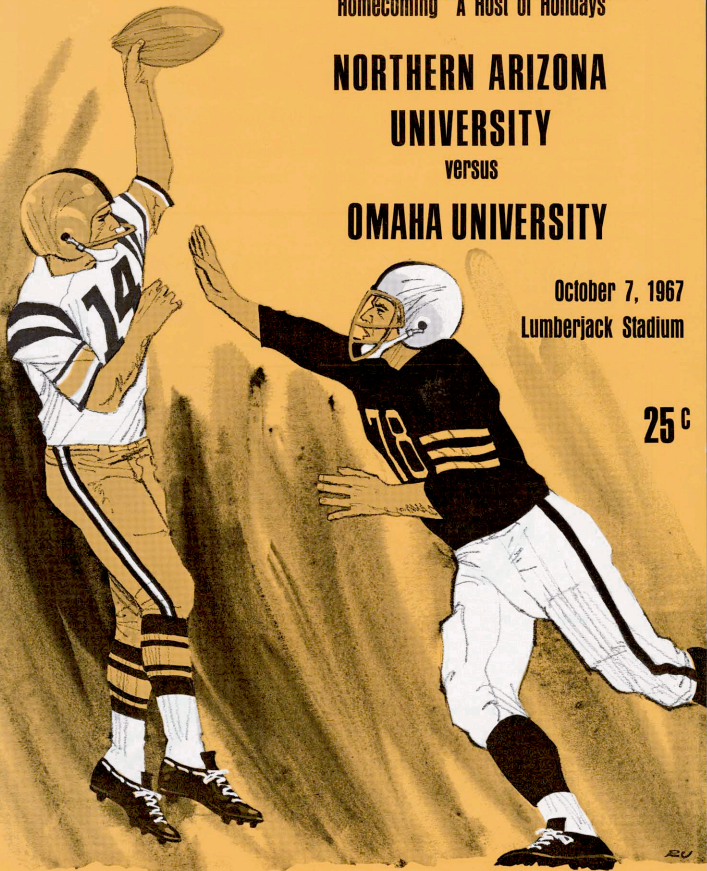

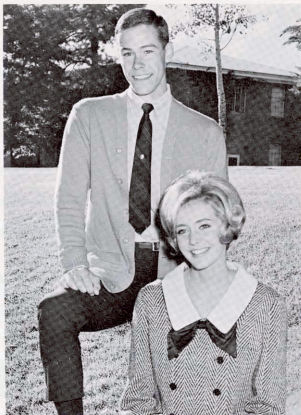
Dear Alumni:

ANDY MacDONALD
Head Coach



DR. TED KECK
Director of Athletics

This year might well be called COACH ANDY MacDONALD'S "harvest year," as it is the culmination of his recruiting efforts over the past two-and-a-half years since taking over in the spring of 1965. He expects to have his best team since his arrival here.

Before taking over as head coach at NAU, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter at State University of Iowa. He coached nine years at Flint Northern High School in Michigan before joining the staff at Iowa.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR TED KECK is a five-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship. He also coached baseball, and during his seven year's tenure as baseball coach, his teams dominated the conference.



OWEN DEJANOVICH begins his second year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college all-America at Thornton J. C.

GLEN RIGGERT is a newcomer to the Lumberjack coaching staff. This spring he finished his M.A. degree at Utah State, where he assisted Tony Knap last year.

Riggert played collegiate ball at Fresno State under Cecil Coleman, and was a member of the undefeated Fresno State team which played in the Mercy Bowl in 1961.



BILL KAUTH is a two-year veteran as head trainer for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjack athletic teams. He received his M.S. degree in physical education at Indiana State University where he also served as assistant trainer.

AL CANIGLIA
Head Coach



VIRGIL YELKIN
Director of Athletics

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH AL CANIGLIA has compiled an enviable record of 36-28-2 over the seven year span at Omaha University. Since 1959, his teams have captured three Central Intercollegiate Conference titles and have been rated in the top 20 by the NAIA three times since 1962.

Caniglia, a 1951 OU graduate, attended Creighton University in 1940 before joining the Navy. Upon discharge following World War II, he played for the Green Bay Packers in 1946 until a knee injury ended his playing career. His coaching trail took him to Norfolk Naval Base in 1946, the Patterson, N. J., semi-pro team in 1947, assistant at St. Louis University in 1948-49, and then to Hillsboro High (Ill.) as coach and dean of men from 1951-58.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR — VIRGIL YELKIN has been at the athletic helm of Omaha University since 1946 and, during the past 21 years has compiled a gaudy 273-80-3 record with his Indian baseball teams. He was named to the NAIA's Helms Baseball Hall of Fame in 1965 after winning the NAIA "Coach of the Year" honors in 1962. His OU nines have been to the national tournament five times, taking runner-up laurels twice. He gained additional honors this summer as one of three coaches of the United States diamond entry in the Pan American Games.

Yelkin graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1936 after a bright athletic career that included All-Big Six recognition as an end.

TODAY'S GAME

There's no doubt that the Lumberjacks will have their hands full against Omaha University's big defensive line and a sparkling offense that is paced by OU's All-America candidate, quarterback Marlin Briscoe, and speedy halfback, Ron Sayers, brother of Chicago Bears great — Gale Sayers. Briscoe sets new OU records every time he plays, and has sparked the Indians to a 2-1 record — 33-41 loss to mighty North Dakota State, 33-0 shellacking of Hiram Scott College, and a 26-21 win over tough Morningside College.

OU's Briscoe completed 27 of 44 passes for 527 yards and seven TDs in the first two games,

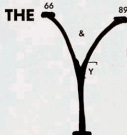
