DR. TED KECK Director of Athletics

This year might well be called COACH ANDY MacDONALD'S "harvest year," as it is the culmination of his recruiting efforts over the past two-and-a-half years since taking over in the spring of 1965. He expects to have his best team since his arrival here.

Before taking over as head coach at NAU, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief recruiter at State University of Iowa. He coached nine years at Flint Northern High School in Michigan before joining the staff at Iowa.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR TED KECK is a fiveyear veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship. He also coached baseball, and during his seven year's tenure as baseball coach, his teams dominated the conference.



OWEN DEJANOVICH begins his second year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-Aemrica at Thornton J. C.



GLEN RIGGERT is a newcomer to the Lumberjack coaching staff. This spring he finished his M.A. degree at Utah State, where he assisted Tony Knap last year.

Riggert played collegiate ball at Fresno State under Cecil Coleman, and was a member of the undefeated Fresno State team which played in the Mercy Bowl in 1961.



BILL KAUTH is a two-year veteran as head trainer for the Northern Arizona University Lumberjack athletic teams. He received his M.S. degree in physical education at Indiana State University where he also served as assistant trainer.

MARVIN C. HELLING LEONARD R. MARTI Head Coach Director of Athletics

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH Marvin C. (Whitey) Helling has compiled a fantastic 56-29-3 record as head coach at UND during the past 10 years. In 17 years of coaching he has had nine championship teams, five second-place teams, one undefeated season (1953), and four seasons with only one loss. In 1965, his Sioux whipped Northern Illinois, 37-20, in the Mineral Water Bowl, and last fall they defeated Parsons College, 42-24, in the Pecan Bowl for the NCAA midwest title.

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS at the University of North Dakota is Leonard R. Marti. He also serves as chairman of the department of physical education and recreation. He joined the athletic staff at UND in 1946 and also serves as gymnastic coach. He has been active in the central district and on the national level of the American Association of Health, Physical Education and Recreation, and has served as an officer at both levels.

TODAY'S GAME

University of North Dakota, one of the nation's top small colleges last year and a contender again this year, should give Coach Andy MacDonald's Lumberjacks one of its toughest tests of the year. This game is also pegged as one of the top football games of the nation this Saturday.

This is MacDonald's "harvest year" since taking over the reins as head coach, and from every indication his team should be an exciting one to watch. Some outstanding newcomers, flanker Rich O'Hara and tailback Chick Harris, are expected to give excitement to the Lumberjack's passing and running attack behind veterans tailback Chris Thornton and quarterback Jim Velasquez.

The North Dakota Sioux have a nucleus of 27 returning lettermen and feature a wide-open passing attack and a tight defense that should give added excitement to the fans today.

A win today for the Lumberjacks could provide the added impetus needed for the upcoming battle next Saturday, Sept. 16 at Ogden, Utah, against another nationally ranked small-college, Weber State. Wins over these two formidable opponents would put the Lumberjacks well on the way up the ladder for national ranking.


