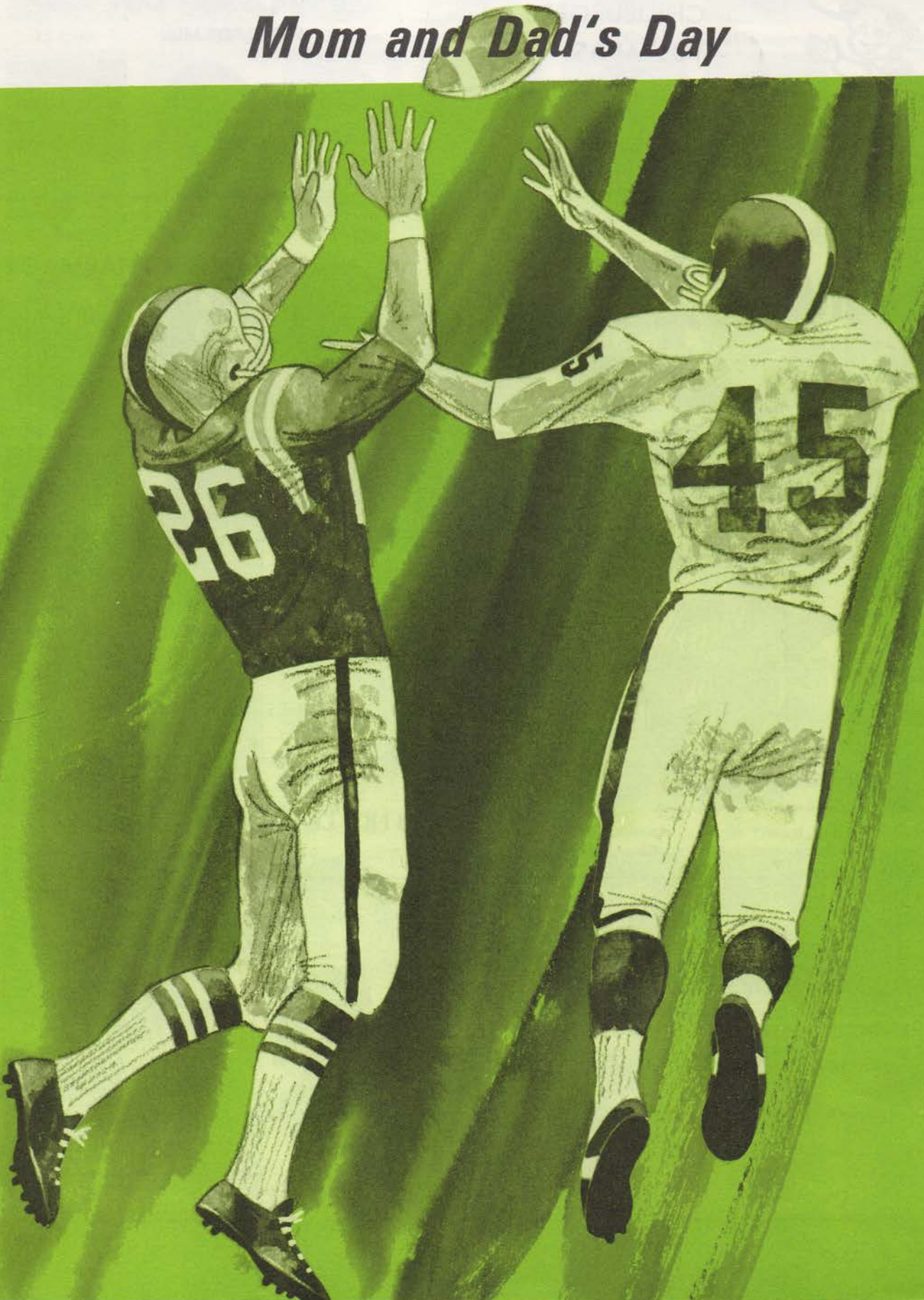

Head Coach



**Dr. TED KECK**  
Director of Athletics

Andy MacDonald is in his fourth year as head football coach of Northern Arizona University's Lumberjacks, and in three years of tough inter-collegiate competition has compiled a 16-13-1 mark with his teams which are noted for his "Roving I" offense and his "Hawk" defense.

Before coming to the Flagstaff school, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief of recruiting at the State University of Iowa under Jerry Burns. Prior to his stint with the "Big 10" school, he coached for nine years at Northern High School in Flint, Mich., winning two "Coach of the Year" awards.

Athletic Director Ted Keck is a six-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship.

Owen Dejanovich begins his third year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.



**KEN HEIZER**

Veteran coach Ken Heizer joins MacDonald & Co.'s staff this year from two years' service on the Iowa State University staff. He began coaching at Hotchkiss, Colo., High following graduation from Western State College at Gunnison, Colo., in 1949. In 1962 he was appointed head football coach at Simpson College, Indianola, Iowa.

**DICK BEECHNER** Head Coach  
**FORREST ANDERSON** Athletic Director

Head Coach Dick Beechner has compiled a 10-5 record in the two years he has been at Hiram Scott, and going into today's game the Scotts have a 5-1 record. Prior to joining the staff at Hiram Scott, Beechner served one year under Bob Devaney at the University of Nebraska. He also has had eight years' coaching experience at Lincoln, Nebr., High School.

Athletic Director Forrest "Fordy" Anderson is well known in athletic circles. Before taking over the reins at the young Hiram Scott College, founded in 1965, "Fordy" was head basketball coach at Michigan State University for 11 years. Prior to that he coached at Drake University and Bradley University. In addition to his AD duties he is head basketball coach.

TODAY'S GAME

The Hiram Scott College "Scotts" are a young inexperienced team, but have come through with a 5-1 won-lost record going into today's game. Reports indicate that they have a fast offensive unit sparked by a couple of scatbacks, Bill Rigney and Jim Dickerson, and passer deluxe Ken Kinsey. Kinsey has tossed 12 TD passes and has compiled 67 completions for 1148 yards this season. His favorite target is split end Walt Krause. Their defense has an exceptionally quick backfield and a hard-charging, maneuverable line. Tackle Bill Startzer is the "Scotts" mainstay on defense.

The Lumberjacks were hit hard by injuries in the Montana State game last Saturday. Defensive tackle Ed Duley suffered a broken jaw that will most likely sideline him for the rest of the season. Tight end Steve Maier came up with a severe ankle sprain that will probably sideline him today. Flanker Bob Grey suffered a back injury which makes him a questionable starter, along with middle guard Ed Kelly and linebacker Ernie Redmond who were on the injured list, but should be ready for action today.

If the Lumberjacks can outwit the Scotts' defensive backs, fans can expect to see quarterback Mike Olson continue to set new Lumberjack season passing records. Every pass he completes records a new record as does every TD pass thrown along with passing yardage. Some of these records go back to 1965. Olson is just one TD pass shy of tying the career record of 15 set by Larry Welsh from 1962-65. Olson has also reset the total offense record set by Welsh in 1965.
