

ANDY MacDONALD Head Coach



Dr. TED KECK Director of Athletics

Andy MacDonald is in his fourth year as head football coach of Northern Arizona University's Lumberjacks, and in three years of tough intercollegiate competition has compiled a 16-13-1 mark with his teams which are noted for his "Roving I" offense and his "Hawk" defense.

Before coming to the Flagstaff school, Mac-Donald was backfield coach and chief of recruiting at the State University of Iowa under Jerry Burns. Prior to his stint with the "Big 10" school, he coached for nine years at Northern High School in Flint, Mich., winning two "Coach of the Year" awards.

Athletic Director Ted Keck is a six-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship.



OWEN DEJANOVICH

Owen Dejanovich begins his third year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.



KEN HEIZER

Veteran coach Ken Heizer joins MacDonald & Co.'s staff this year from two years' service on the Iowa State University staff. He began coaching at Hotchkiss, Colo., High following graduation from Western State College at Gunnison, Colo., in 1949. In 1962 he was appointed head football coach at Simpson College, Indianola, Iowa.



JOHN ALVAREZ Head Trainer

Another newcomer to the athletic staff, Alvarez came to NAU from Colorado State University where he was an assistant trainer while completing his MA degree. He earned his BS degree at the University of Colorado and was also assistant trainer.

SAM WINNINGHAM DR. GLENN ARNETT Head Coach Athletic Director

Sam Winningham has been head coach at SFVS for six years and during that time has compiled a 18-37-1 record. He did his prep coaching at Phoenix Union and compiled an enviable 59-36-2 record including two state championships. His Phoenix Union wrestling team stacked up a 58-5 record and five championships.

His Matadors last year compiled a 6-3 record and went to the Junior Rose Rowl, losing 35-13 to West Texas State.

Dr. Glenn Arnett has been at San Fernando Valley State since its inception in 1957 and under his direction each of the twelve varsity sports has developed into a well-rounded program.

Dr. Arnett is a former Arizonan and earned nine athletic letters at Mesa High School.

#### TODAY'S GAME

Homecoming fans can expect an exciting ball game today with two teams that exploit the passing offense to the utmost.

Last week the Lumberjacks' passing game piloted by quarterback Mike Olson shifted to high gear for the first time this season against Northern Illinois University Huskies at DeKalb. Olson and company, flanker Bob Grey, tailback Sonny Campbell, end Steve Maier and fullback Bud Wiedoff combined for 18 passes and four TDs as the Lumberjacks took a 43-14 win to boost the Axer record to 3-2.

The Matadors have been having their troubles this season compiling a 1-2 record, but even in last Saturday's 35-12 loss to Fresno State, the Matadors displayed a dangerous passing attack. Sparking their passing attack are quarterbacks Steve Hartman and newcomer Mike O'Neil. Hartman has hit 60 percent of his passes this season. O'Neil, who made his first appearance in the Fresno game, completed 16 of 21 pass attempts, a fantastic 76 percent completion. Their favorite targets are flankers Brian Ashley and Randy Whitsitt, both speedy runners.

It is very likely that the outcome of the game this afternoon will hinge on the defensive units of both teams, and if the Lumberjack defense continues to function like it did last Saturday the Matadors will have trouble getting into high gear. Against the NIU Huskies the stout Axer defense held the Huskies to 86 yards rushing and 80 yards passing.
