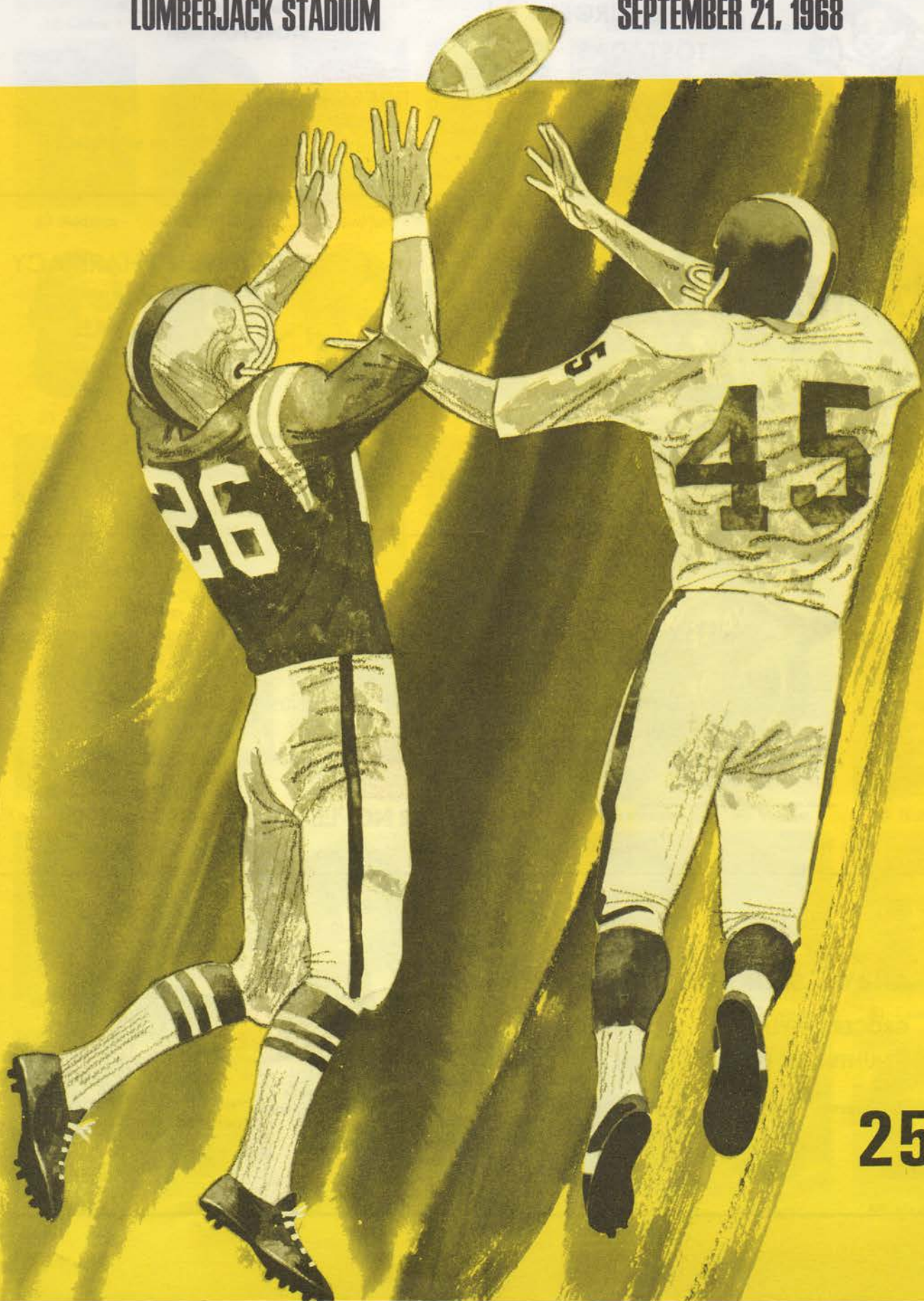

Head Coach

Andy MacDonald is in his fourth year as head football coach of Northern Arizona University's Lumberjacks, and in three years of tough inter-collegiate competition has compiled a 16-13-1 mark with his teams which are noted for his "Roving I" offense and his "Hawk" defense.

Before coming to the Flagstaff school, MacDonald was backfield coach and chief of recruiting at the State University of Iowa under Jerry Burns. Prior to his stint with the "Big 10" school, he coached for nine years at Northern High School in Flint, Mich., winning two "Coach of the Year" awards.

Athletic Director Ted Keck is a six-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship.

Owen Dejanovich begins his third year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.

Veteran coach Ken Heizer joins MacDonald & Co.'s staff this year from two years' service on the Iowa State University staff. He began coaching at Hotchkiss, Colo., High following graduation from Western State College at Gunnison, Colo., in 1949. In 1962 he was appointed head football coach at Simpson College, Indianola, Iowa.

DON REED - HEAD COACH

In his 10 seasons as head coach at Long Beach, Don Reed has not had a team finish below the .500 mark in the last nine years and experts say his 1968 squad may be his best ever.

His finest season at Long Beach came in 1965 when the 49ers put together a 9-1 mark, losing 27-21 to Los Angeles State, a team that went undefeated and won the California Collegiate title.

Since San Diego State has dropped out of the CCAA, Long Beach State is picked to capture the 1968 title. After a slow start last fall, Reed re-grouped his forces and came back strong to wind up with a 5-5 record and a tie for second place in the CCAA with San Fernando and Fresno State.

Offense is the name of the game to Reed and his coaching staff. An example is the fact they have averaged more than four touchdowns a game over the last four years. Long Beach has been playing football for 13 years and the school has fashioned a 67-50-2 record. Long Beach has battled 22 schools in its history; only two have come from outside California - NAU and the University of Nevada.

TODAY'S GAME

Long Beach State will bring a touted passing combination of quarterback Dave Merrill and end Bill Parks. Returning to face his former Northern Arizona University teammates will be defensive end Cliff Specht (89).

Specht was a starting defensive end for NAU in 1966 before transferring to Long Beach. The 6-2, 205-pound senior will try and turn the tide against his former teammates. In 1966 Specht helped NAU to a 32-12 win over the touted 49ers.

The winner of today's game will take a 3-2 series edge. Long Beach won 7-6 games in 1956 and 1957, NAU won 32-12 in 1966 and last year the Axers rallied to win 26-21.

NAU's running game behind giant Roy Whalen, who gained 145 yards in 21 carries against Drake last week, will need to be augmented by a passing game. Defensive standouts for NAU last week were Ed Duly (79), Mark Lomas (66) and Ed Kelly (76). Next week NAU will host tough Weber State College, a team that holds a 4-0 edge over NAU.
