

ANDY MacDONALD Head Coach



Dr. TED KECK Director of Athletics

Andy MacDonald is in his fourth year as head football coach of Northern Arizona University's Lumberjacks, and in three years of tough intercollegiate competition has compiled a 16-13-1 mark with his teams which are noted for his "Roving I" offense and his "Hawk" defense.

Before coming to the Flagstaff school, Mac-Donald was backfield coach and chief of recruiting at the State University of Iowa under Jerry Burns. Prior to his stint with the "Big 10" school, he coached for nine years at Northern High School in Flint, Mich., winning two "Coach of the Year" awards.

Athletic Director Ted Keck is a six-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship.



OWEN DEJANOVICH

Owen Dejanovich begins his third year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.



KEN HEIZER

Veteran coach Ken Heizer joins MacDonald & Co.'s staff this year from two years' service on the Iowa State University staff. He began coaching at Hotchkiss, Colo., High following graduation from Western State College at Gunnison, Colo., in 1949. In 1962 he was appointed head football coach at Simpson College, Indianola, Iowa.



JOHN ALVAREZ Head Trainer

Another newcomer to the athletic staff, Alvarez came to NAU from Colorado State University where he was an assistant trainer while completing his MA degree. He earned his BS degree at the University of Colorado and was also assistant trainer.



JACK SWARTHOUT
Athletic Director and Head Football Coach

Since assuming the duties of both head football coach and athletic director at the University of Montana last year, Jack Swarthout has put a drive into the University's athletic program which has not been seen in Missoula for many years. Its immediate results showed in the 7-3 football record last fall, the best mark the school has had since 1937.

Swarthout came to Montana, where he played football (1940-42), from a high school position in Olympia, Wash., where his football teams compiled a 50-24-2 record in seven seasons.

TODAY'S GAME

Twelve Lumberjacks make their final appearance under the Blue and Gold colors of NAU—defensive back Chick Harris, fullback Lacy Colter, defensive back Bruce Branstrom, linebacker Ernie Redmond, defensive end Bud Wiedoff, linebacker David Frank, tackle Ted Nelson, guard Ozie Slade, tackle Bob Glassner, guard Larry Small, tackle Dennis Kiefer, and guard Luigi DiFelice.

The Lumberjacks take a three-game winning streak and a 5-4 won-lost record against the Montana Grizzlies who have a 2-6 record.

The 1968 season hasn't been all it was cut out to be for Montana. The Silvertips were preseason choices to cop the Big Sky Conference title and tabbed by some to go undefeated.

But after seven games, the Grizzlies are once again in the cellar of the Big Sky loop, and have won but 2 of 6 games. It all started with a relatively easy 37-10 victory over tough North Dakota, and it looked like pre-season predictions would be borne out.

The following week they stumbled to South Dakota, 21-0, but bounced back strong against Portland State, 58-0, and from then on it's been five straight losses to Idaho, 56-45; Idaho State, 23-13; Utah State, 50-3; Montana State, 29-24 and to Weber State, 20-16.

Every pass thrown, completed and for a TD by quarterback Mike Olson sets a new Lumber-jack passing record, some of which were set back in 1958. Olson has reset or tied nine one-game or season records in addition to resetting a career record for passing so far this season.
