

ANDY MacDONALD Head Coach



Dr. TED KECK Director of Athletics

Andy MacDonald is in his fourth year as head football coach of Northern Arizona University's Lumberjacks, and in three years of tough intercollegiate competition has compiled a 16-13-1 mark with his teams which are noted for his "Roving I" offense and his "Hawk" defense.

Before coming to the Flagstaff school, Mac-Donald was backfield coach and chief of recruiting at the State University of Iowa under Jerry Burns. Prior to his stint with the "Big 10" school, he coached for nine years at Northern High School in Flint, Mich., winning two "Coach of the Year" awards.

Athletic Director Ted Keck is a six-year veteran at NAU. He also directs the physical education division at NAU. Prior to coming to NAU he was athletic director at Minot State, Minot, North Dakota.

At Minot State, Dr. Keck coached football and baseball, and in 1954 his football team won the NDIAC championship.



OWEN DEJANOVICH Assistant Coach

Owen Dejanovich begins his third year as assistant to Andy MacDonald. "Oats" was an outstanding lineman on the 1962-63 Lumberjack football teams. He made junior college All-America at Thornton J. C.



KEN HEIZER Assistant Coach

Veteran coach Ken Heizer joins MacDonald & Co.'s staff this year from two years' service on the Iowa State University staff. He began coaching at Hotchkiss, Colo., High following graduation from Western State College at Gunnison, Colo., in 1949. In 1962 he was appointed head football coach at Simpson College, Indianola, Iowa.



JOHN ALVAREZ Head Trainer

Another newcomer to the athletic staff, Alvarez came to NAU from Colorado State University where he was an assistant trainer while completing his MA degree. He earned his BS degree at the University of Colorado and was also assistant trainer.



This is Arslanian's fourth season as head football coach of the Weber State College Wildcats. His Wildcat teams over the past three years have compiled a 20-8-0 record and have been right in the midst of the Big Sky Conference title race during that time. Prior to taking over at Weber, Arslanian compiled a 64-26-3 record at Dixie Junior College.

Dale Gardner took over the athletic leadership reins from Dr. Reed Swenson this summer following Swenson's retirement from administrative duties. Prior to his appointment at Weber, Gardner was assistant athletic director at Utah State for 13 years.

TODAY'S GAME

Even with only three offensive starters returning, Coach Arslanian's Wildcats will be one of the toughest teams on the Lumberjack schedule this season. They won their opener 27-12 over South Dakota State, and last weekend they were idle and spent the off-week to sharpen up for today's game with the Lumberjacks.

In last Saturday's 26-20 win over Long Beach State the Lumberjack offense showed much improvement over the previous Saturday, when they fell to Drake, 30-14. The Axer defense came through with pre-season expectations. Up until five minutes left in the ball game, they had held Long Beach to just 52 yards on the ground and 54 yards via the airways.

Axer junior fullback Sonny Campbell sparked the Lumberjacks on the ground with a total of 108 yards, and tailback Roy Whalen came through with an additional 89 yards. The bright spot in the Lumberjack offensive was the passing combination of quarterback Mike Olson and flanker Bob Grey. Olson completed 12 of 27 passes for 157 yards and four TDs. Grey snagged 9 for 122 yards and three TDs.

A win today for the Axers would be the first in the series which stands 4-0 in favor of the Wildcats.
