Axers Go for Best Since '58

Lumberjacks Host Eastern Greyhounds

NAU (SNS)—If Northern Arizona University beats Eastern New Mexico University Saturday afternoon before a Mom and Dad's Day crowd at Lumberjack stadium, the win will boost NAU to a 7-2 record which will assure NAU of its finest finish since the 1958 team which was 11-1.

A win Saturday will mark the first time NAU has gone undefeated at home since 1958. Over the five year period from 1963-68, the Lumberjack fans had occasion to cheer only 55 per cent of the time after home games because a combined 14-10-1 record went into the history books during that span of time. Over the last four-year span, NAU was 11-8-1 at home.

Eastern is not likely to be too impressed by the fact the Lumberjacks have been ranked among the nation's top 20 teams all season because the Lumberjacks will be the fourth nationally ranked team the Greyhounds have faced so far this fall.

Earlier the Greyhounds played Arkansas State University, Colorado State College and last week it was Abilene Christian College and all are currently in the top 20 of the national polls.

Two years ago Eastern was not impressed with NAU at all as the Greyhounds came to Flagstaff with 45 players, 36 of whom were freshmen and the ENMU team took home a 7-0 win. That NAU defeat came on the heels of a game played in Ogden, Utah, in which the Lumberjacks

dropped a 29-28 contest to the Weber Wildcats.

Eastern will bring a 2-5 record into the game, but as mentioned earlier, three of these defeats have been to nationally rated teams. NAU and Eastern are tied 7-7 in a series that has developed into a rough and tumble affair.

If Eastern finds rough sledding against the Lumberjacks Saturday in the final home game of the season for NAU, the visitors will have a bonafide reason.

In three previous home games this fall, the Lumberjack defense has given up but one touchdown before the home folks and that came in the final 1:16 of the game in the season-opening 38-7 win over Cal Poly of Pomona. NAU blanked Montana State,

35-0, at Homecoming and two weeks ago Whitworth College of Spokane, Wash., fell 61-0 at NAU's Band Day.
