4 Loggers Rank Pro

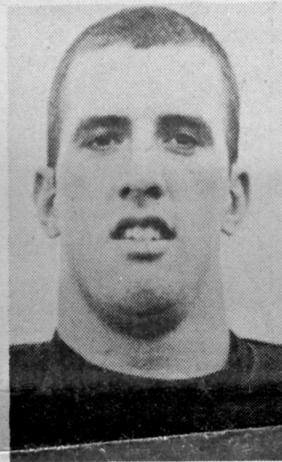

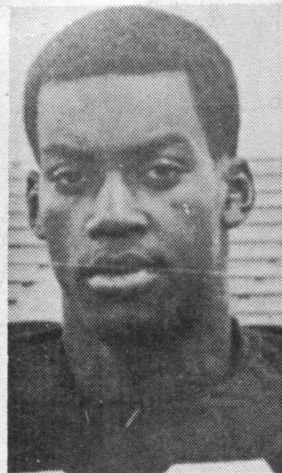

While in Logger attire he figured in many of the close contests that prodded the record setting season for NAU, especially in the West Texas and Weber State victories.

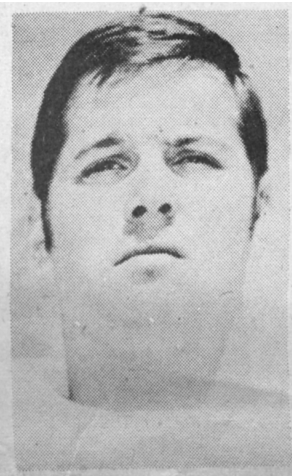


CHARLIE BROWN

Pass catching records, as well as many other team records, fell by the wayside last season when Brown nailed down the starting role as flanker, at NAU.

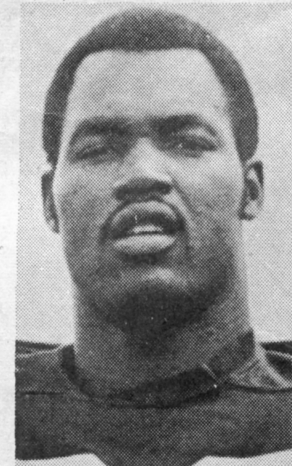
He holds the one game reception record with 12, against Eastern New Mexico, and picked off three aeri-als good for TD's in the Whitworth game to tie for top honors in that department.

Brown gained 245 yards in the Whitworth game, on pass- es, to hold the record on re- ceiving. His 11 TD's upped the old record for one season by two and set a new mark in touch-

Campbell kicked two field goals in the Fresno State game and marked a school record. He handled the kick-off and conversion attempts in his absence as a running back.

He has already scored two touchdowns in his professional appearances for Atlanta.

Both Tillman and Campbell signed as 'free agents' while Lomas was drafted in the eighth round of the player draft and Brown in the 14th round.

Coach Symank, when asked about the four involved, stated the starting role as flanker, at NAU. "We're certainly pleased that they made the cuts and it's good to know they were prepared to head into the pro camps this summer. They all have the drive, stamina and enthusiasm to make fine football players, and they're certainly proving it."

Symank went on to say "It's a rough profession to crack and it takes determination and ages, to hold the record on re- gressiveness to play in those ranks, something all four had when they played for us last year."
