Four years ago when Sonny Campbell was graduated from Marana High and headed for Northern Arizona University, he had no idea his football career in a Lumberjack uniform would be so diversified.

As a freshman, Campbell played guard on the 1966 NAU team that compiled a 6-4 mark. In 1967, Campbell was switched to tight end because of his blocking ability and he made several clutch receptions and wound up the season as the Axers' second leading scorer with 37 points ----four TD's and 13 of 17 extra points.

In 1968 NAU was short of running backs and the versatile Campbell wasaswitched to tailback and he responded by leading the team in rushing with 598 yards and was third in scoring with 40 points on Six. TD's and four of seven conversions. Campbell's rushing yardage was attained in less than eight games as he fractured his right wrist in the first half of NAU's eighth game.

That wrist fracture kept Sonny from breaking the all-time NAU career scoring record as he re-fractured the same wrist during NAU's third game this fall against Montana; however, he took over the placekicking chores. This fall Campbell ended the season as the Lumberjacks second leading scorer with 46 points on two TD's, 28 of 34 conversions and two field goals--giving him 123 career points, five shy of the record set by Ron

Cote in four years (Campbell's scoring was in three seasons) 1956-59.

Despite the fact Campbell missed the mark, NAU set or tied 44 records while rolling to a 7-3 record---best in 11 seasons. The record total is the biggest assault on the history books in NAU's football history. Over the last 14 seasons, NAU has only one losing season while Campiling a fine 88-44-6 record.

The records were split equally between individual and team efforts ---each having 22. There were eight one-game standards set and four tied while nine new team marks were established.

Individually, seven one game marks were set and three tied while six new season marks were entered into the record books and four new career marks were set and one tied.

Quarterback Bob Stewart, Flanker Charlie (Good Grief) Brown and split end Bob Grey, all seniors, had the biggest hand in the individual records broken.

Most yards gained passing: Bob Stewart, 2,123 which breaks the old record of 1,977 set last fall by Mike Olson.

Most passes caught: Charlie Brown, 63, which breaks the old record of 38 set by Bob Grey in 1968.

Most receiving yardage: Charlie Brown, 1,134, which breaks the old record of 601 set in 1958 by Al Res.

Most yards total offense: Bob Stewart, 1,957, which breaks the old record of 1,874 set in 1968 by Mike Olson.

Host punts: Bob Gray, 61, which breaks the old record of 56 set in 1967 by Jim Youngs.

Host Funting yards: Bob Grey, 2,250, which breaks the old record of 2,063 set in 1967 by Sin Youngs.

FEW INDIVIDUAL ONE-GAME RECORDS:

Most passes completed: Bob Stewart, 23, against Eastern New Mexico which breaks the old record of 21 set by Mike Olson in 1966 against Montana State and tied in 1969 by Stewart against West Texas State.

Nost passes caught: Charlie Brown, 12, which breaks the old record of 10 jointly held by Dustan Everman (1960 against Western New Hexico); Bob Grey (1968 against Horthern Illinois); and Charlie Exown in 1969 against Hontana State, Whitworth and Weber. Most yards gained passing: Bob Stewart, 368, against Weber State which breaks the old record of 312 set in 1968 by Mike Olson against Hiram Scott.

Host total yards gained: Bob Stewart, 346, against Weber State
which breaks the old record of 316 set in 1967 by Chris Thornton
against Western Illinois University. Note: Stewart's was all passing
while Thornton's was all rushing.

Longest Pass-run from scrimmage: Jim Beckenhauer, 86 yards to Bob Brown against the University of Montana which breaks the old record of 82 set in 1968 by Mike Olson to Walt Mannon against Eastern New Mexico.

Host field goals in one game: Sonny Campbell, 2, against Presno State, breaking the old mark of one held by several MAU players, including Mike Hercer who is now the placekicker for the Green Bay Packers.

ONE-GAME INDIVIDUAL RECORDS TIED:

Nost touchdown passes: Bob Stewart, 4, against Whitworth College and Hastern New Mexico which ties the record jointly held by Ted James (1966 against Central Missouri); Mike Olson (1968 against Long Beach and Morthern Illinois).
