

goals—giving him 123 career points, five shy of the record set by Ron Cote in four years (Campbell's scoring was in three seasons) 1956-59.

Despite the fact Campbell missed the mark, NAU set or tied 44 records while rolling to a 7-3 record—best in 11 seasons. The record total is the biggest assault on the history books in NAU's football history. Over the last 14 seasons, NAU has only one losing season while compiling a fine 88-44-6 record.

NEW INDIVIDUAL CAREER RECORDS

Most yards gained passing: Bob Stewart, 2,123 which breaks the old record of 1,977 set last fall by Mike Olson.

Most touchdowns passes caught: Bob Grey, 14 (1968-69) which breaks the old record of 13 set by Al Rex in 1956-59.

Most punts: Bob Grey, 109 (1968-69) which breaks the old record of 100 set by Jim Youngs in 1966-67.

Most yards punted: 4,151 (1968-69) which breaks the old record of 3,866 set by Jim Youngs in 1966-67.

Most passes completed: Bob Stewart's 139 ties the record of 139 set by Olson in 1968.

NEW INDIVIDUAL ONE-SEASON RECORDS

Most touchdowns scored: Charlie Brown, 11, which breaks the old record of nine jointly held by Cruz Salas, 1956; Dave Estrada, 1963; George Herman, 1964; and Chris Thornton, 1966.

Most yards gained passing: Bob Stewart, 2,123 which breaks the old record of 1,977 set by Mike Olson in 1968.

Most touchdown passes caught: Charlie Brown, 11, breaks the old record of eight jointly held by Al Rex, 1958; and Bob Grey, 1968.

Most passes caught: Charlie Brown, 63, which breaks the old record of 38 set by Bob Grey in 1968.

Most receiving yardage: Charlie Brown, 1,134, which breaks the old record of 601 set in 1956 by Al Rex.

Most yards total offense: Bob Stewart, 1,957, which breaks the old record of 1,874 set in 1968 by Mike Olson.

Most Punts: Bob Grey, 61, which breaks the old record of 56 set in 1967 by Jim Youngs.

Most Punting yards: Bob Grey, 2,289, which breaks the old record of 2,063 set in 1967 by Jim Youngs.

ONE-GAME INDIVIDUAL RECORDS TIED

Most touchdown passes: Bob Stewart, 4, against Whitworth College and Eastern New Mexico which ties the record jointly held by Ted James (1966 against Central Missouri); Mike Olson (1968 against Long Beach and Northern Illinois).

Most touchdown passes caught: Charlie Brown, 3, against Whitworth which ties the record jointly held by Don Bracken (1957 against Westminster, Utah) and Bob Grey (1968 against Long Beach).

Most touchdowns scored: Charlie Brown, 3, against Whitworth which ties the record jointly held by Cruz Salas (1956, Western New Mexico); Angel Salas (1957 against LaVerne, Cal., and Panhandle, Okla.); Jim Eis, (1961 against Eastern New Mexico); Chris Thornton (1967 against Western Illinois University and University of Nebraska at Omaha); Bob Grey (1968 against Long Beach); Roy Whalen, (1968 against Eastern New Mexico).

NEW ONE-SEASON TEAM RECORDS

Most touchdown passes: 26, breaking the old record of 19 set in 1968.

Most total yards gained: 3,669.

Most total first downs: 29, against Whitworth breaking the old record of 28 set in 1963 against Western New Mexico.

Most first downs passing: 17, against Whitworth breaking the old record of 13 set in 1968 against Hiram Scott.

Most total yards gained: 595, against Whitworth, breaking the old record of 561 set in 1963 against Western New Mexico.

Lowest rushing defense: minus 40 yards against Los Angeles State breaking the old record of minus 24 yards set in 1956 against the University of San Diego.

ONE-GAME TEAM RECORDS TIED

Most points scored: 61, against Whitworth tying the record set in 1935 against Adams State College and re-tied in 1937 against New Mexico Highlands.

Most touchdowns scored: 9, against Whitworth which ties the record set in 1935 against Adams State, tied in 1937 against New Mexico Highlands and tied again in 1956 against the University of California at Riverside.

Most opponents punts blocked: 2, against Cal Poly of Pomona which ties the record held against several teams.

Most times had punts blocked: 1, against Weber which ties the record set by several opponents.
