goals-giving him 123 career points, five shy of the record set by Ron Cote in four years (Campbell's scoring was in three seasons) 1956-59.

Despite the fact Campbell missed the mark, NAU set or tied 44 records while rolling to a 7-3 record—best in 11 seasons. The record total is the biggest assault on the history books in NAU's football history. Over the last 14 seasons, NAU has only one losing season while compiling a fine 88-44-6 record. 
