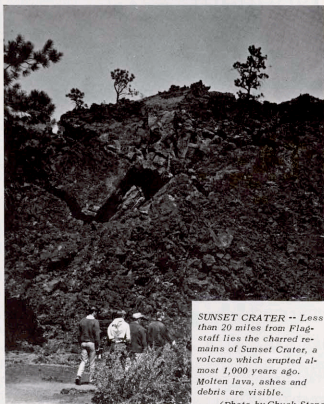

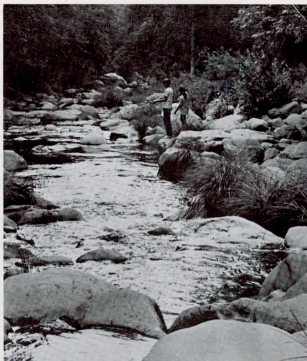

## TODAY'S GAME

Drake University, today's opponent, has already taken care of two other Big Sky Conference teams this fall. The Bulldogs opened the season by upending Idaho State University 39-10 and the following week Drake erupted in the second half to beat Weber State 36-19 in Ogden, Utah.

NAU has won three of its last four Homecoming tilts. In 1966 NAU beat Central Missouri 34-16; in 1967 the University of Nebraska at Omaha fell 41-13; in 1968 San Fernando State of California overcame an early 12-0 NAU lead to record a 21-20 win and last year the Lumberjacks defeated Montana State, 35-0.

NAU will face the Bulldogs with a crippled squad today. The Lumberjacks have a multitude of young players on this year's squad and injuries to key experienced players have taken their toll in the last three games. Senior quarterback Jim Beckenhauer is nursing a bad knee while sophomore runningback Jack DeGrenier has bruised ribs and junior running back Dan White is out for the year with a dislocated elbow.

Drake is boning up its program with the idea of reentering the Missouri Valley Conference, major college division, within the next few years. The Bulldogs participate in the basketball segment of the MVC.

In facing Drake's potent attack, the Lumberjacks face losing their fourth straight game, something no NAU team has done since 1955. At the mid-point of the season, NAU's 10 foes for 1970 have recorded a 23-23 record.

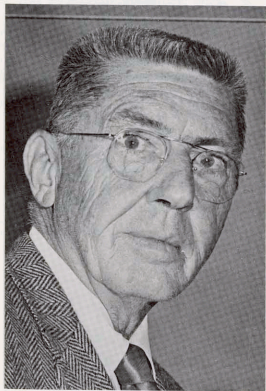

### THIS IS **DRAKE**

Drake University is located in Des Moines, Iowa, the state capitol which has a metropolitan population of 275,000. The University, founded in 1881 has 5,300 students and a professor-student ratio of 17-to-1.

Drake has five colleges, a graduate college which offers eight degree programs, a School of Journalism and a Law School. Beyond the master degree level, students may earn educational specialist degrees in administration, curriculum and instruction and guidance and counseling.

Each summer Drake holds a special orientation program for the 1,400 incoming freshmen and their parents. The privately endowed university accepts outstanding high school students upon completion of their junior year.

The regular school year has two semesters, the first ending when the Christmas Vacation starts and the other at the end of May. Summer school consists of two five-week sessions.

Student activities blend in with the academic world as part of the total educational experience at Drake. The athletically inclined will find bowling, swimming, tennis, golf and other recreational sports. A full intercollegiate program also exists. Drake is a basketball powerhouse in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Bulldogs played in the 1969 and 1970 NCAA University Division playoffs, finishing third in 1969. Drake played in the 1969 NCAA College division Pecan Bowl, losing 29-21 to Arkansas State. Each spring Drake hosts the Drake Relays and last spring Drake hosted the NCAA track and field championships.

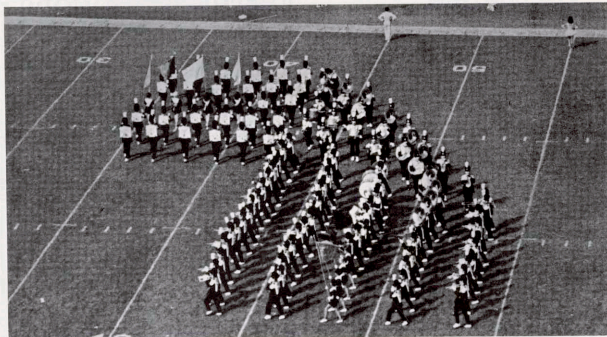

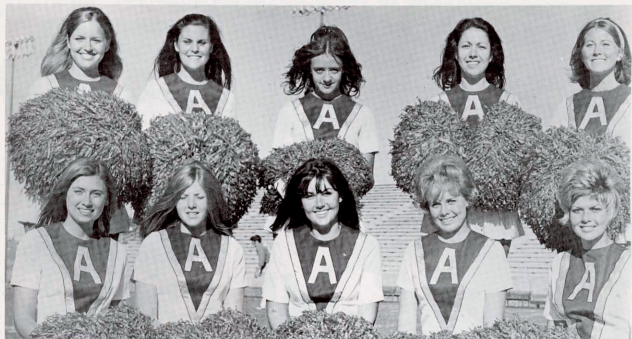

### COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

The College of Education at Northern Arizona University has changed its organizational structure to meet with modern needs of its students.

As of September 1, the College of Education was reorganized into five departments, two of which are the Men's and Women's Physical Education Departments, which comprise the Division of Health, Physical Education and Recreation. Other departments are Psychology, Curriculum and Instruction and Administration, Supervision and Foundations.

The North Central Association has given NAU the authority to develop three doctoral programs leading to Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) degrees in instruction and curriculum, administration and psychology. These programs are

now being planned and hopefully, candidates will be admitted at the start of second semester.

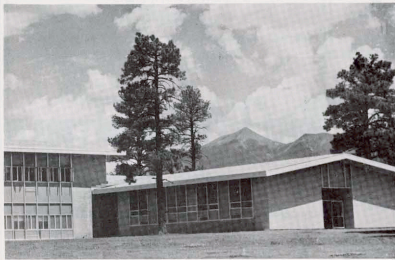
New this fall were three elementary student teaching centers, two in the Phoenix area and one in Flagstaff. The two in Phoenix are located at Madison and Phoenix No. 1, permit student teachers to complete their entire professional semester in Phoenix, including student teaching.

This fall the old Bureau of Educational Services and Surveys was re-organized into The Educational Resources Management Center. It will operate under the Department of Administration, Supervision and Foundations.

NAU's College of Education supplies teachers and administrators for schools throughout the nation and in particular the southwest.

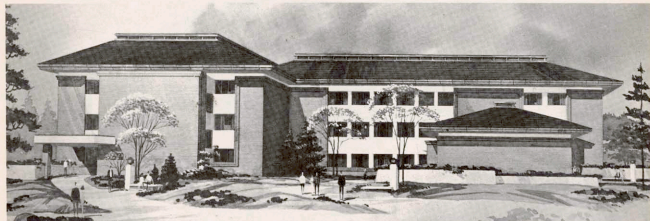

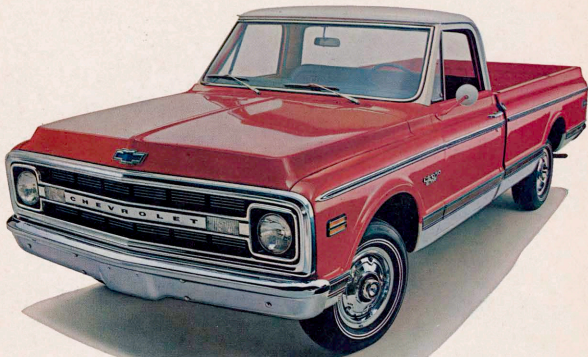
### New Educational Concepts
