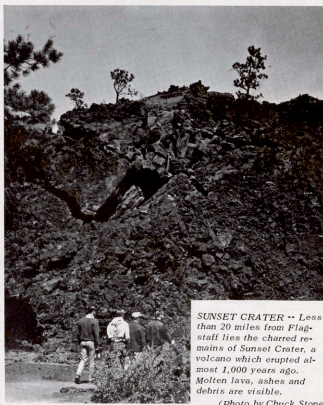

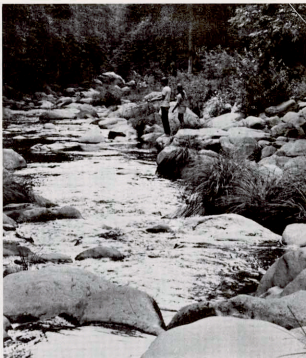

TODAY'S GAME

Even before Northern Arizona University joined the Big Sky Conference, it had begun to cultivate a rivalry with Weber State. NAU and Weber have met yearly in football since 1964 with the Wildcats holding a 5-1 series edge.

NAU won last year's contest 21-19 in Ogden, Utah with a dramatic fourth quarter finish in which the Lumberjacks scored all 21 points in the final stanza.

In a pre-season poll of Big Sky coaches and sports information directors, Montana was the overwhelming favorite to win with Weber and Idaho State battling it out for second. Last week Idaho State beat Weber 30-14 to just about sew up second place; however, with a torrid finish, the Wildcats could do no worse than third.

Weber brings a 3-4 record into today's contest with NAU. The schools have three common foes this fall. Montana beat NAU 20-0 then the following week knocked off Weber 38-29. Drake beat Weber on the road 36-19 and then conquered NAU 31-17 in Flagstaff. Weber belted Montana State in Ogden, 56-13 two weeks ago and last week Montana State beat NAU 28-6.

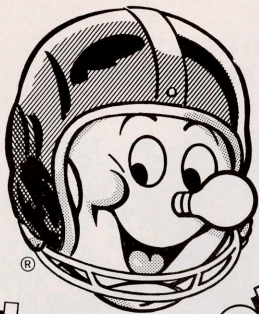

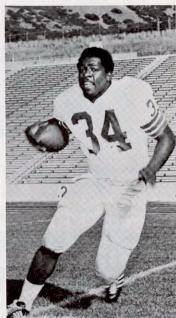

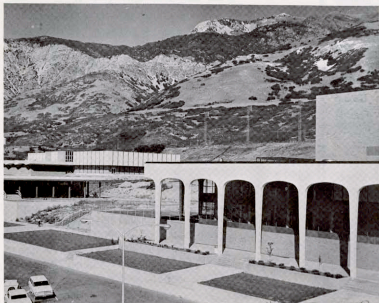

weber facts

Weber is one of the six charter members, of the Big Sky Conference which started athletic competition in the fall of 1963. Weber won the Big Sky all-sports trophy for the third consecutive year during the 1969-70 school year and became the first school to retire the trophy for having won it three times.

Weber started as an Academy of the Mormon Church in 1889, became a junior college in 1922 and a four-year school in 1962. The school is on a 275-acre campus between the Wasatch Mountains and the Great Salt Lake. Weber is a Liberal Arts College and offers several B.A., B.S. and associate degrees. It has 10,800 students, 2,200 of which are night schoolers.

Ogden, with 77,000 residents, is Utah's second largest city. It is known as the industrial center of the intermountain west as some 190 manufacturing, industrial and wholesale firms employ some 26,000 with an annual payroll of 75 million. Nearby is Promontory Point where the "Golden Spike" was driven, linking the east and west with the transcontinental railroad.

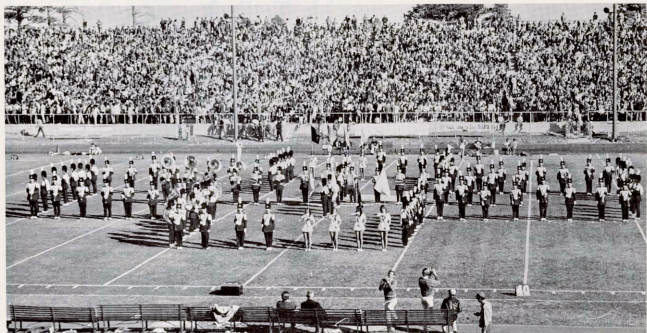

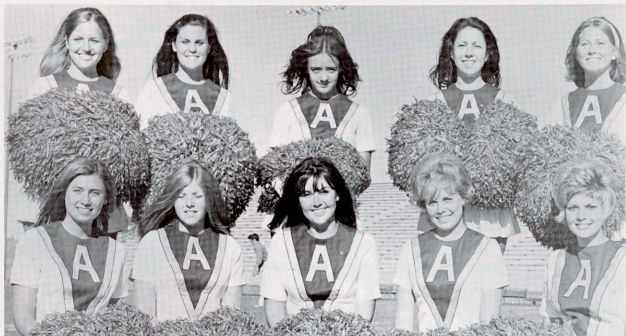

SCHOOL OF FORESTRY

Northern Arizona University's School of Forestry, founded in 1958, has turned out more than 200 graduates, many of whom are distinguishing themselves across the nation in their chosen profession. Some 10 percent of the graduates have obtained advanced degrees.

Starting in the fall of 1971, NAU's School of Forestry will have a unique approach to upper-division study in that the entire junior year and the first semester of the senior year will deal exclusively with forestry curriculum -- the only such approach in the nation.

NAU's School of Forestry is the only such accredited school in the entire Southwest section of the nation. Students may earn a bachelor of science in forestry and at the graduate level, a master of science in forestry is offered.

Foresters have a great responsibility in putting to best use the 664 million acres of forest land in the USA -- one-third of the land mass of the nation.

Each fall the NAU foresters conduct a Forestry Field Week in which the foresters display their skills. Some of the competition is open to non-foresters who also get the chance to display their skills -- or the lack of them. The climax of the week is a short skirt contest, which attracts upwards of 30 NAU coeds.

Northern Arizona University is taking a unique approach in educating its students. NAU's new South Academic Center features the cluster-campus concept because of the desire for continued emphasis of undergraduate teaching and preserving the long-standing NAU emphasis of the importance for the individual student, which is designed to keep the individual from becoming a "number."

The new academic center, three-fifths of a mile from the main campus, will not be bound by long-standing traditions which will permit the students housed on the "cluster campus" to seek their own identity.

The Academic Center will include the College of Engineering, the College of Business Administration and the College of Scientific and Humanistic Studies. When fully developed, the center will house between 4-6000 students.

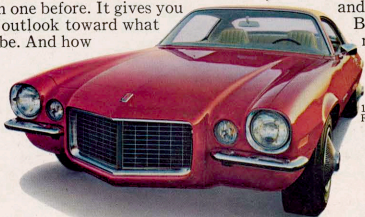
