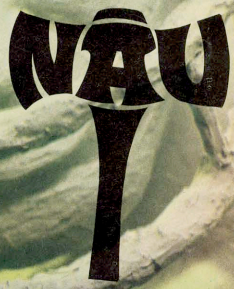

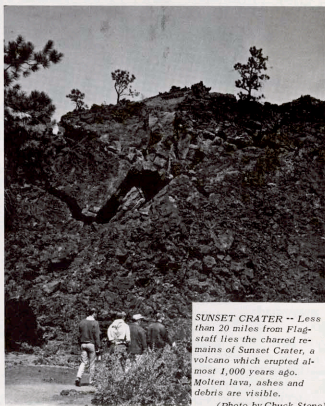

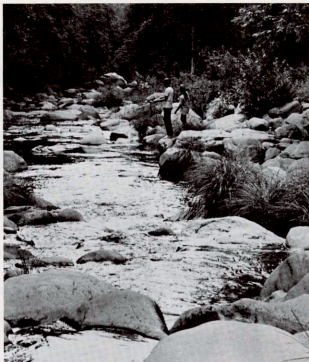

TODAY'S GAME

Fresno State will bring a 6-3 record into today's meeting with Northern Arizona University, who has a 2-7 mark and is in the midst of its longest losing streak in 15 years.

NAU opened the season with two straight wins, however key injuries suffered in the 33-0 win over California State of Los Angeles started NAU on its long tail spin. NAU had only nine seniors on its squad at the start of the season and only one has remained un-injured all season -- free safety Mike Hlavac.

Fresno is coming off two consecutive beatings at the hands of Pacific Coast Athletic Association foes, San Diego State (56-14) and Long Beach State (50-14). NAU and Fresno have met two common foes this fall -- Montana State and Cal State of Los Angeles. Montana State beat Fresno 26-12 then beat NAU 28-8. NAU beat Cal State of LA 33-0 while Fresno blasted the LA team 51-6. Comparative scores would indicate a close contest; however, NAU has suffered heavily from injury while Fresno is relatively the same team that started the season for the Bulldogs.

"THE AXE WILL BE BACK"

When Northern Arizona opened its season with just nine seniors and a limited supply of juniors, the Lumberjack coaching staff knew that if key injuries befell the NAU team, a long season would be in store.

That's just what has happened to NAU and the Lumberjacks are suffering their poorest season in 15 years; however, the future looks bright as more than 85 percent of this year's team is due to return next fall. If key spots can be plugged with junior college transfers, the 1971 NAU team could well be one of the finest in the nation.

Individual effort this fall has been tops by Steve Maier, the senior from Shelby, Ohio. Maier started his Lumberjack career four years ago as a linebacker, then moved to tight end as a sophomore and junior and this year he moved to flanker and against Weber, he moved into a running back spot and responded with 96 yards in 20 carries. Number 82 will be missed at NAU next year.

THIS IS FRESNO STATE

Some 14,500 students attend Fresno State College, located in the central part of the state of California. Fresno is noted for its sprawling farm area and cotton, grapes, dried fruits, poultry and livestock spur the economy, for more than 160,000 residents.

Fresno State occupies some 1,410 acres, of which 1,190 acres are near-by farm land. The college, founded in 1911, offers bachelor degrees in 61 areas and master degrees can be earned in 33 areas of study. Currently Fresno State is engaged in conducting some 100 research projects, valued at over a million dollars.

Northern Arizona University and Fresno State first met in 1931 with NAU taking a 26-2 victory -- that same year, Arizona State University blanked Fresno, 7-0.

Last year Fresno beat NAU 27-18 in Fresno and in 1966 the Bulldogs downed NAU, also at Fresno, 14-12. A robust football schedule has become a trademark at Fresno State as over the last 30 years Bulldog football teams have played 11 and 12-game schedules nine different years. This year's slate calls for 12 games, more than any college or university team in the nation.

Today's contest ends NAU's season while the Bulldogs have dates left with San Jose State and the University of Hawaii.

Through the years, Fresno has won but five of 18 games against Big Sky schools and in 1966 and 1969 the Bulldogs managed to upset NAU -- so, perhaps the Lumberjacks can return the favor today against the nationally ranked Bulldogs.

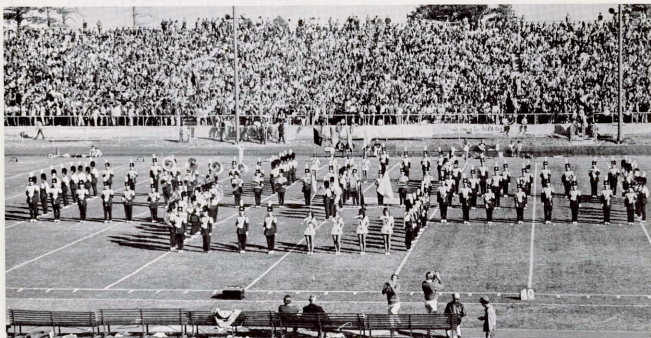

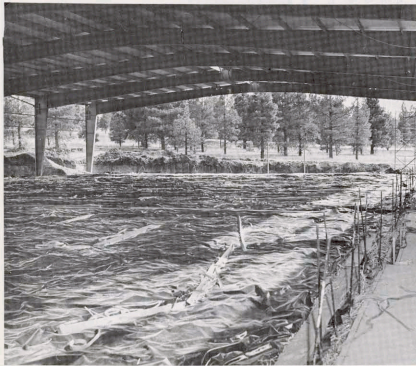

Flagstaff's Recreation and Parks Department has grown rapidly over the last few years and today 42 department employees, including 13 full-time, are on hand to help assist local citizens -- children, youth and adult -- find a relaxing, enjoyable program.

Northern Arizona University's students are also eligible to participate in the massive, well-planned recreation program which numbered 154,000 last year, many -- obviously -- participated more than once!

Flagstaff has some 1,800 acres for parks and recreation either developed, or in the process of being developed. Included in the program are 13 public school buildings, three recreation centers and two pools.

By the time the first snow flies, Flagstaff will have one of the finest winter sports complexes in the nation. Currently a 300-capacity ice skating rink is under construction and the final touches are being applied to a municipal ski area which can accommodate more than 400 at a time. Skiing will be free while a nominal charge will be made for ice skating.

Swimming, volleyball, basketball, slow and fast pitch softball are only some of the adult activities while teen dances, bicycle rodeos and special parties at Christmas, Thanksgiving, Halloween, Easter and Valentines Day are held for youngsters.

Special activities and classes, at a nominal fee, will be offered if enough people ask. Information can be obtained by contacting Ken Ingols, director of recreation and parks at 774-5281 (ext. 4757). Assisting Ingols is Byron Elmendorf, recreation supervisor and Earl Newman, superintendent of parks.
