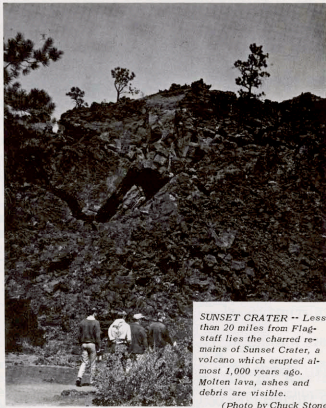

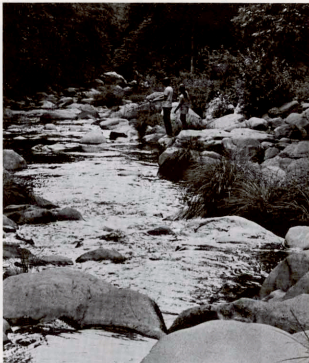

Opening the season with a team like the Quantico Marines is quite a task says John Symnak, head football coach at Northern Arizona University. The Marines compiled a fine 9-2 record last season against some of the best small college teams in the nation.

Last year NAU had its best season in 11 years as a 7-3 mark was entered into the history books; however, the Lumberjack team was hit heavily by the graduation plague. NAU is in the midst of a program change. Previously NAU relied heavily on junior college transfers. Coach Symnak and his staff have switched to recruiting from the high school level, primarily within the state.

Next Saturday, NAU will host California State of Los Angeles for a 1:30 p.m. contest while Quantico will be hosting Eastern Michigan University. NAU opens Big Sky Conference play two weeks from today when the Lumberjacks meet potent University of Montana in Flagstaff at 1:30 p.m.

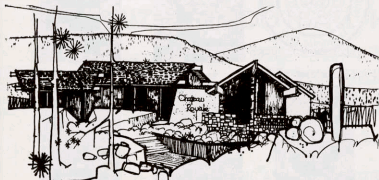

BIG SKY

The Big Sky Athletic Conference will have two new members this fall in Northern Arizona University and Boise State of Boise, Idaho. Charter members of the Big Sky are the University of Montana (Missoula); Montana State University (Bozeman); Weber State (Ogden, Utah); Idaho State University (Pocatello); the University of Idaho (Moscow) and Gonzaga University (Spokane, Washington). Gonzaga participates in all sports except football.

The University of Montana, ranked second nationally last fall in the college division of both wire service polls, is the overwhelming favorite to retain its Big Sky crown this fall. Teams comprising the Big Sky had 16 of its players selected in last season's pro football draft. This placed the Big Sky eighth nationally for having the most players selected.

Creative imagination of the student is what the College of Creative Arts at Northern Arizona University is seeking.

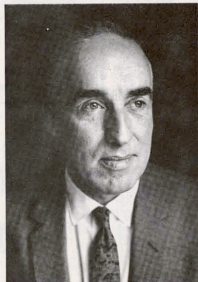
The College of Creative Arts offers students courses in art, humanities, journalism, music, radio and television, speech and theatre.

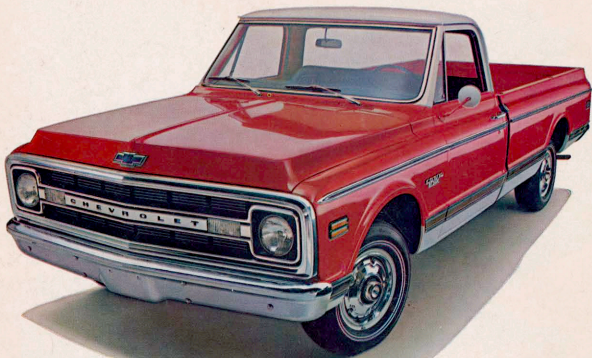
New Educational Concepts
