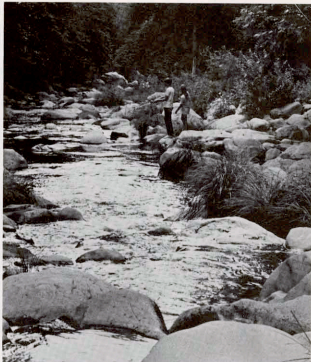

California State College at Los Angeles and Northern Arizona University have a lot in common -- both are in re-building campaigns and both have an abundance of home-grown talent.

Last year the Cal-State LA Diablos were winless in nine starts, including a 20-14 defeat at the hands of NAU's Lumberjacks in a game played in the Rose Bowl in Pasadena, Calif.

A new Diablo Head Coach, Bob Enger, has re-vamped the Cal State LA attack and he has a lot of junior college talent on hand and this will be their first game as a unit. Due to his being hired late, Enger got a late start on the recruiting trail and he missed getting some of the JC talent he would have liked to have in his fold.

Next week NAU will open Big Sky play by hosting rugged University of Montana. The Grizzlies are defending Big Sky champs and were rated second nationally last season by both wire service polls.

**PLAYERS OF THE WEEK** -- Last week the NAU coaching staff selected senior flanker Steve Maier as back of the week for his three touchdown receptions in the 25-3 win over Quantico Marines. Junior linebacker Mike Boettcher was tabbed as lineman of the week as he recovered one fumble, forced two more, made 10 unassisted tackles and helped on a dozen more.

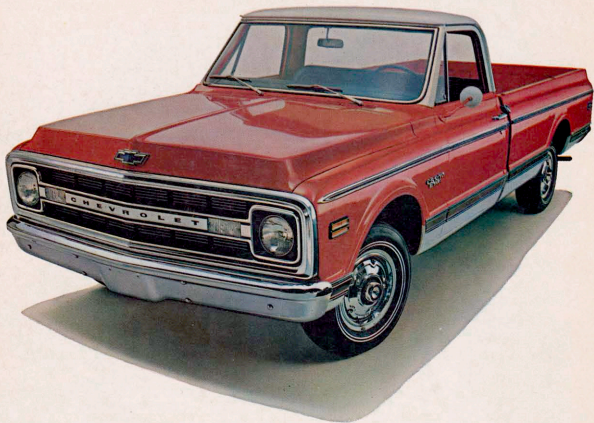
### New Educational Concepts
