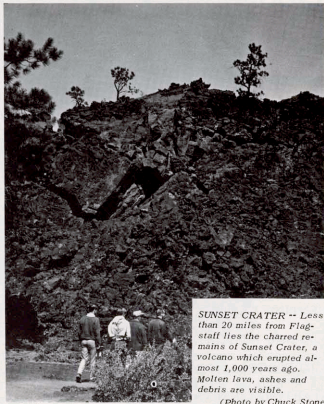

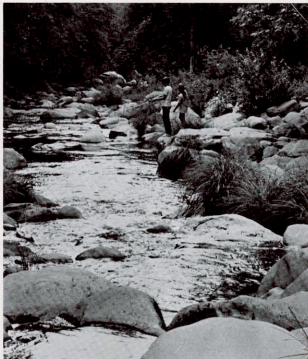

TODAY'S GAME

The potent University of Montana Grizzly football team will launch its bid for a second consecutive Big Sky championship today against Northern Arizona University. Montana and NAU will each carry 2-0 non-conference records into today's conference opener.

Last fall NAU and Montana met under similar circumstances, each had 2-0 marks, and Montana took a 52-7 win at home. The series started in 1966 with NAU winning in Flagstaff 34-8. In 1967 Montana won at home 10-7 and in 1968 NAU won 18-0 at Lumberjack Stadium.

Montana's last regular-season defeat came at the hands of NAU, 18-0, to close the regular 1968 season for both teams. The Grizzly team went 10-1 last year, losing to North Dakota State, 30-3, in the Camellia Bowl in Sacramento, Calif.

Montana was rated second nationally last season in both wire service polls. Next week NAU will be on the road to take on New Mexico Highlands who was rated sixth nationally last season, in Las Vegas, New Mexico. Highlands has not lost a regular-season game in the last three seasons.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Last week junior defensive end Pat Powers was selected as NAU's lineman of the week while junior running back Dan White was the top back of the week in NAU's 33-0 non-conference win over California State College of Los Angeles. White gained 90 yards rushing and had some key third-down runs while Powers was part of the defensive alignment that held the Diablos to just 11 yards rushing and 80 yards total offense. In two games, NAU's defensive front has thrown opposing backs for 35, yes 35, losses.

DEFENDING BIG SKY CHAMPIONS

UNIVERSITY OF MONTANA

Five great wilderness areas and five scenic river valleys are near the 201-acre University of Montana campus.

The University, located at the base of Mt. Sentinel, was chartered in 1893 by the Third Legislative Assembly and it has grown from 50 students and seven faculty members to more than 8,700 students and 400 full-time faculty members, of which more than half have their doctorates.

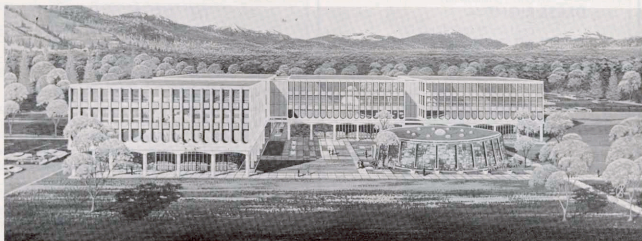
More than 40 buildings dot the main campus which is less than a five-minute drive from downtown Missoula, a city of 37,818 (1970 estimate). Missoula is 100 miles from the state's western border of Idaho. The area has long been known for its timber, dairy ranching, meat products and mining.

Currently the University is involved in a multi-million dollar building program which includes a \$2.2-million dollar field house expansion, a \$3.1-million dollar phase of a three-stage science complex and a \$6-million dollar library. Recently completed projects include a \$4-million dollar student center, a new biological science station and a 154-acre family living complex.

The University has the largest inland biological station (167 acres) in the nation located on scenic Flathead Lake; a 27,000-acre experimental forest and a 296-acre research facility at Ft. Missoula. Montana is a charter member of the Big Sky Athletic Conference which started competition in the fall of 1963.

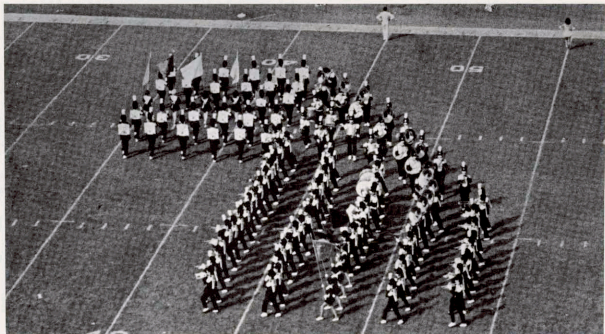

Historic Northern Arizona

History is being made today as the Northern Arizona University football team lines up to oppose the 1969 Big Sky football champions, the University of Montana.

NAU is playing its first conference football game today in nine years since the folding of the old Frontier Conference which included teams from Arizona, Colorado, Oklahoma and New Mexico. The Big Sky includes schools from Montana, Idaho, Washington, Utah and Arizona.

Northern Arizona is rich in history and it is fitting that some of that history be recalled today, while new history is being made.

The top picture shows the 1916 Northern Arizona Normal School (NAU)

football team before it took on Prescott High School. In the early days, many colleges, lacking for competition, played high school and town teams.

In the middle, we see the bustling streets of copper mining town Jerome as they looked in 1917. Today Jerome, 60 miles from NAU, is a ghost town. (Note the one-way street)

The bottom picture shows the Colorado River expedition of Major John Powell in 1869. Powell, a Civil War hero, became the first to travel through Grand Canyon's gaping, breath-taking gorges. The Glen Canyon Dam's Lake Powell is named in his memory.

Grand Canyon, 75 miles north of the NAU campus, is recognized as one of the seven wonders of the world.

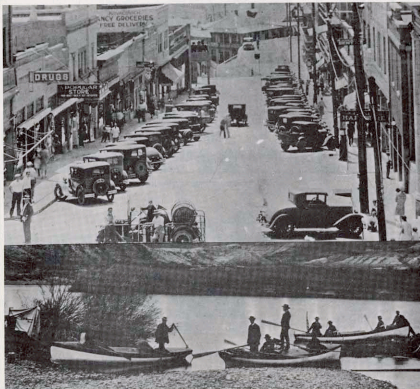

The new academic center, three-fifths of a mile from the main campus, will not be bound by long-standing traditions which will permit the students housed on the "cluster campus" to seek their own identity.

The Academic Center will include the College of Engineering, the College of Business Administration and the College of Scientific and Humanistic Studies. When fully developed, the center will house between 4-6000 students.
