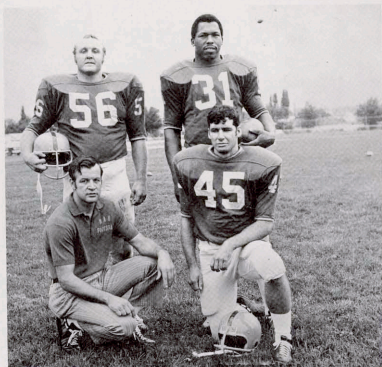

THE GREAT METEOR CRATER



Between Flagstaff and Winslow, on highway 66, lies the world's best-preserved impact-collision crater. The 570-foot deep crater was formed some 22,000 years ago and today it is studied by astronauts before journeys to the moon, earth scientists and by public school students.

The crater is named after Daniel Moreau Barringer, who did the original research in the area. He determined that the giant depression was caused by a falling meteorite. The crater is open daily until sundown.

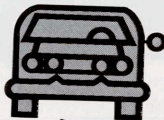

TONIGHT'S GAME

Northern Arizona University's football team will be playing with something it hasn't had in quite a while.

A winning streak!

The Lumberjacks, fresh from a 25-16 Homecoming win over Montana State University, their first win ever in Big Sky Conference football action, host the Rebels from the University of Nevada at Las Vegas tonight in a pivotal game for both squads.

The Lumberjacks, under the direction of first-year head coach Ed Peasley, ran up against four of the nation's toughest college division teams and opened their season on a brisk 6-4 note (8-major) before last week's Montana State conquest.

NAU lost its season opener to top ranked North Dakota, 42-9; Drake, 38-13, a team that is rated 8th and 23-7 to ninth-rated Weber State of the Big Sky.

The remainder of the League schedule, although by no means an easy road to travel, should provide the Lumberjacks with a good chance of breaking even on the year, or even perhaps turning the season into a winner!

The Rebels are also looking to the NAU game as an indication of things to come. UNLV, 2-1, suffered its lone loss to highly regarded Utah State University, 27-7, and last week turned a 14-10 defeat into a 23-14 win over a good Santa Clara team in the final minute by scoring twice. With a minute left and the ball on their own 25, the Rebels trailed by four points, quarterback Jim Starkes completed two passes for 75 yards and a score, then the Rebels ran back a pass interception in the closing seconds.

NAU's attack will again center around the handling of quarterback duties by sophomore Vince Creviston and the educated toe of sophomore place kicker Gary Galati who kicked his fifth field goal of the season last week to set a new one-year high at NAU. He needs just one more to tie the career mark of 10 set by Monte Harris in 1964.

Both Creviston and Galati did most of the offensive work last week while fullback Milford Suida chipped in with some key runs and freshman linebacker Billy Wagner was in on 15 stops.

Another sophomore will be leading the Rebels -- Starkes, who was the team's top passer a year ago as a freshman! Against Santa Clara, he completed 12 of 24 attempts for 203 yards and two TD's. His main target will be senior Greg Brown, who had six receptions for two scores last week.

This will be the first game ever in football between NAU and UNLV; however, the two schools have been foes in basketball, baseball, golf, tennis, track and cross country.

THIS IS NEVADA-LAS VEGAS

The University of Nevada at Las Vegas is building at such a rapid rate that the school could easily grow to 10,000 students within the next few years.

This is a far cry from the humble beginning in 1951 when a few classes were offered in Las Vegas High School. The present campus opened in 1957 and has been growing since. In the first few years the University of Nevada at Reno had control until 1965 when Nevada Southern University was created and the present name, the University of Nevada at Las Vegas came about in 1969 when the State Legislature set up a state university system. The other state school is the University of Nevada at Reno.

Intramurals and sports play a big part

of the UNLV total program. The Rebel leaders are currently working on a nine-lane all-weather track, two baseball fields and 12 tennis courts. With the 1973 completion, the UNLV will have one of the finest physical education plants in the nation.

A seven-story Humanities Building will double the classroom space on the UNLV campus. Other buildings under construction include a Performing Arts Theatre and a College of Education.

The school graduated its first class in 1964 and now many programs are offered at the master-degree level and a PhD in education is slated to become the school's first doctoral program.

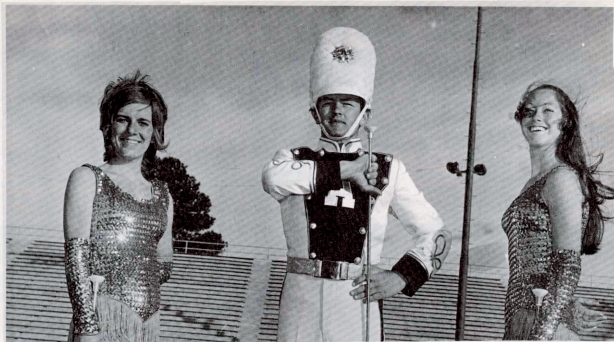

Weber's Wildcats led NAU 13-0 entering the final 15 minutes of play and into the fourth quarter the score was 19-7. The fourth quarter passing heroics of quarterback Bob Stewart to flanker Charlie Brown brought the victory. That final quarter saw Stewart passing for 206 of his school record 368 yards and two TD's. Brown caught 10 of those passed for 192 yards and two scores.

With Weber leading 19-14, the Wildcats quick kicked 66 yards out of apparent danger; however, on the next play Stewart passed 65 yards to Brown to put the Axers back in business and with 6:08 to play Brown hauled in a 5-yard scoring strike from Stewart. Brown was drafted by Detroit in the 11th round and Stewart by Denver in the 16th. Brown is still with the Lions and Stewart is on the Philadelphia taxi squad.
