THE GREAT METEOR CRATER



Between Flagstaff and Winslow, on highway 66, lies the world's best-preserved impact-collision crater. The 570-foot deep crater was formed some 22,000 years ago and today it is studied by astronauts before journeys to the moon, earth scientists and by public school students.

The crater is named after Daniel Moreau Barringer, who did the original research in the area. He determined that the giant depression was caused by a falling meteorite. The crater is open daily until sundown.

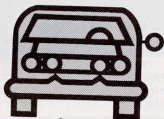

New Mexico Highlands and Northern Arizona University are both tough competitors. Both come into today's contest, however, with an 0-1 record as NAU dropped a 42-9 decision to nationally ranked North Dakota State last week and the Cowboys lost 17-7 to Sul Ross.

Both Coaches, Ed Peasley at NAU and Les Davis at Highlands, are in their first season at the respective schools.

According to Davis this years Cowboy schedule is the toughest they've ever seen and he feels there are two areas in which Highlands will have to rebuild, the offensive line and the linebackers.

Graduation took several of the powerful key players from Highlands but Davis is optimistic about 1971. "I think we have the basis of a good offensive team" said Davis.

Quarterback Don Woods, who gave the Lumberjacks plenty of headaches at Las Vegas, N.M. last year, is back in the saddle and behind him will be Henry Villarreal, who sat out last season with hepatitis. Newcomers Sam Williams and Jim Brockington will give the Cowboys some added strength this season in their running game.

The nucleus of the defensive line will be lettermen Ed Chacon and Dwight Currie while the backs, defensively, will center around Gary Parr, Nelson Edwards and Mark Cotney.

"We'll have to play heads-up football" says Davis, "and we won't be able to afford mistakes or have any letdowns to come up with a winning season."

NORTHERN ARIZONA UNIVERSITY

Coach Peasley was pleased with performance of the Lumberjacks in their 42-9 opening loss to North Dakota State, ranked second in the nation's small college poll, but commented, "We do have some weak areas and hope to be ready for the strong Highlands squad."

Last week's opener saw Mike "Bo" Boettcher highlight the defense as he led the team in tackles. Boettcher also picked off the first interception of the season for the Lumberjacks in that contest.

Another highlight, offensively, was the performance of Dick Baserman. Baserman hauled in six passes for 114 yards and one touchdown. Last season he played tight end while this year he's a wide receiver.

Two backfield members to watch for will be veterans Bill Tate and Danny White. Although they didn't fare to well against NDS, they are powerful and quick competitors. They should see plenty of opportunities to show their stuff today.

Quarterback Craig Holland, playing his first season with NAU, will be throwing to some fine receivers in Rosie Van, Chris Hyla, Walt Mannon and Bill Edm. All are quick and have good hands.

Last years encounter between these two teams found Highlands overpowering NAU 47-7.

This years contest should see a battle as both teams are looking for that first victory of the season.

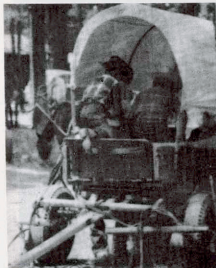

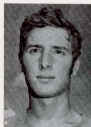
TENOCHTITLAN

New Mexico Highlands University, one of five state-supported four-year universities in New Mexico.

Highlands is located at Las Vegas, some 130 miles North of Albuquerque and 100 miles South of the Colorado state line and Texas lies about 100 miles to the East.

Historians say that the campus was once the meadowland-camping site of wagon trains as they toiled along the Santa Fe Trail.

The Highlands campus is at 6,500 feet above sea level, similar to NAU's. As a result, both campuses are provided with dry climates, cool summers and relatively mild winters.

To the west of the Highlands campus lie the 12,000-foot Sangre de Cristo mountains and to the north of the NAU campus lie the 12,000-foot San Francisco Peaks.

Highlands offers bachelor degrees in 14 areas, master's degrees in 13 areas and associate (two-year) degrees in five areas.

Highlands athletic teams have provided a lot of excitement for local sports fans -- especially in football. The Cowboys have produced a 35-4-1 mark over the last four years and three of the losses have come in post-season play. Cowboy football moved into the winning side of the ledger in 1965 with a 5-4 mark and they have been going since. The 1966 mark was 8-1.

Jack Scofield revived Cowboy football; however, he met with a tragic death in an automobile accident while on a recruiting trip to Texas and his assistant, John Levra, kept the program rolling with the 35-4-1 mark.

So, over the last six years Highlands has rolled up an admirable 48-9-1 record. Last year Highlands accomplished what no other team could do and that was to beat the University of Hawaii, in Honolulu -- 21-10.

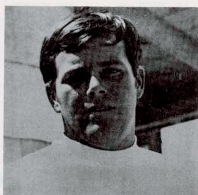

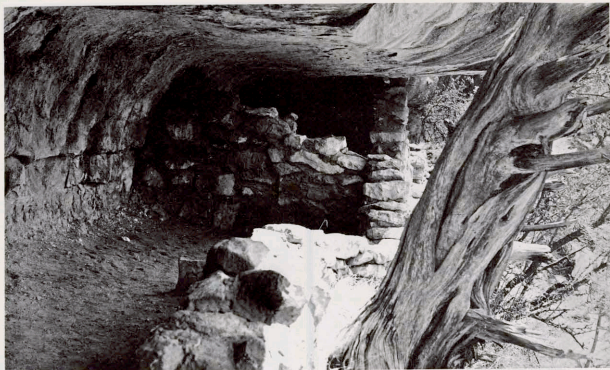
