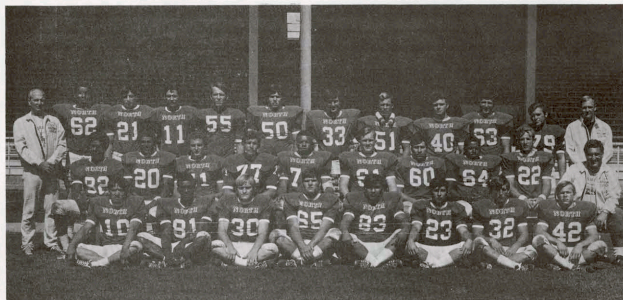

VINCE GIBSON -- Head Football Coach - Kansas State University. During the past four years under Gibson the Kansas State University Wildcats have emerged from the obscure intercollegiate football into one of the nation's established football powers.

Gibson's 1970 team tied for second in the rugged Big Eight Conference. The team's 6-5 overall record last year was the most wins recorded by a K-State team since 1934, the five conference victories equaled a long-time best.

In those four years Gibson has produced 10 All-Big Eight performers and an All-American, Clarence Scott. Gibson was head coach of the North in the recent North-South All-Star football game.

In 1969 he was selected as Coach of the Year by the New York Daily News, and Playboy Magazine picked him as pre-season Coach of the Year in 1970.

He is a 1955 graduate of Florida State. Gibson served three years as head football, basketball and track coach at South Georgia Junior College before returning to his alma mater as top assistant. His success there won him a similar position at Tennessee, where he helped build Tennessee's football fortunes back to a pre-war level.

JERRY TARKANIAN -- Head Basketball Coach - Cal State at Long Beach. In just two short years as head coach at Cal State, Tarkanian has accomplished the near-impossible - a pair of conference championships, back-to-back records of 23-3 and 24-5, and an NCAA Western Regional bid. After he had dominated California junior college basketball for a number of years, Cal State Long Beach hired Tarkanian to build its basketball program and he has certainly done that. Tarkanian started his coaching career with five years in high school as San Joaquin Memorial, Antelope Valley and Redlands High Schools. He then went to Riverside City College and won the state title three years running (1963-66). In 1966 he moved to Pasadena City College and took a team that had only won three games the previous year and produced a state title team and the following year came up with a second place, losing the title in overtime. He is a 1956 graduate of Fresno State College and completed his Master's work at the University of Redlands.

ED PEASLEY -- Head Football Coach - Northern Arizona University. Peasley was named head coach at Northern Arizona University last winter and he brings to NAU a tradition of success. He came to NAU from Stanford University where he was linemen coach. Championship football teams have been Peasley's bag, both playing and coaching for the best part of the past 20 years. He has been associated with four Rose Bowl teams, three times as a coach and once as a player. He was an outstanding lineman on the University of Washington team that defeated Wisconsin in the 1960 Rose Bowl. He was a student assistant at Washington when the Huskies trimmed Minnesota in the '61 Rose Bowl. He was line and end coach of the Huskies when they were decided by Illinois in the '64 Rose Bowl game. He moved to Stanford in 1966 and was linemen coach of the Stanford Indians when they downed Ohio State just last New Year's Day in the Rose Bowl.

J. MICHAEL FLOURNOY -- Coconino County Attorney. Flournoy spoke to members of the Arizona Coaches Association on the coaches liability in athletics. A native of Williams, Flournoy has been a practicing attorney in Flagstaff since 1962 following graduation from the University of Arizona Law School. He is a member of the law firm of Preston, Flournoy and Flick. He also served as chief deputy county attorney before being elected county attorney.

Other lecturers at the Coaching School **JON COLE**, assistant track coach at Arizona State University and a world champion and Olympic weight lifter. Cole spoke on weight training programs for different sports and food supplements. **DAN POWELL**, offensive coach at Kansas State University. His topic was "K-State Passing Game and Pass Protection."

All Star Coaches

NORTH FOOTBALL - Head Coach Bill Saunders - Phoenix Union High School - Saunders is no stranger to football coaching in Arizona -- he's been at it for 21 years. A native of Flagstaff, Saunders graduated from Phoenix Union and then served two years in the Air Force. Following discharge attended Arizona State University where he quarter-backed the football team. He received his B.A. degree in 1950 and his M.A. in 1955. His first coaching assignment was at Coolidge High School and the following year was named assistant at Phoenix Union. For the past 10 years he has been head coach and during that time the Phoenix Union Coyotes won division championship in 1962, 1968 and in 1970.

SOUTH FOOTBALL - Head Coach Richard Pottle - Safford High School. In the two years under head football coach Richard Pottle, the Safford High "Fighting Bulldogs" won the 1969 state championship title and were runners-up last year. Pottle has compiled a 22 win, one loss record while at Safford. Coach Pottle and also his wife Joyce, is a 1960 graduate of the University of Maine. Following graduation he coached one year in Maine before moving to Tularosa, New Mexico, where he was an assistant under Boone Jackson for several years. The Tularosa High School won the district title four years running and played for the state championship three times. Pottle also assisted Jackson in the 1966 New Mexico All Star game, which they won.

NORTH FOOTBALL ASSISTANTS -
 Chuck Milo, assistant coach at Phoenix Union High School and Diz Reeves, head coach at Round Valley High School. MILO has been coaching for the past 19 years, 11 in Arizona. He earned his B.S. degree at Wayne State University in Michigan where he played four years of football and baseball, and then earned his M.S. degree at Michigan. He coached eight years in Michigan before moving to Arizona. He coached one year at Cortez prior to Phoenix Union. His two sons, Chuck and Tim, played football at Maryvale. Daughter Rosemary is a junior Olympic swimmer and is competing in the finals at Colorado Springs. A native of Ozona, Texas, REEVES has been head football coach at Round Valley for the past three years, and also baseball coach. At Round Valley he has compiled a 31-3, win-loss record. His 1968 and 1969 teams were state runners-up and last year were the undefeated state champions. Reeves received his B.S. degree at Sul Ross State and his M.A. at Northern Arizona University. Before moving to Round Valley he coached at Rankin, Texas, Odessa, Texas, Jal, N.M., and Boerne, Texas. In 1970 he coached the North All Star baseball team to victory. His overall coaching record is 47-6.

SOUTH FOOTBALL ASSISTANTS -
 John Bonefas, assistant coach at Safford High School and Vern Friedli, head coach at Morenci High School. BONEFAS has been coaching in Arizona for the past six years, and the last four years as backfield coach and head basketball coach of the Safford "Bulldogs." Prior to taking over duties at Safford, Bonefas spent two years coaching at Tuba City High School. He is a graduate of South Dakota State University. FRIEDLI is a 10-year veteran coaching in Arizona with six of those years at Morenci High School. He has been head football coach at Morenci the past three years and also is head baseball coach. His football coaching record the last three years is 17-10-1 and this past year was named coach of the Year, "A" South Conference. Prior to the Morenci position, Friedli was head football and baseball coach at Sunnyside Junior High School in Tucson for four years. He is a member of the board of the Coaches Association.

NORTH ALL STAR TRAINER - Mike Nesbitt, head trainer at Northern Arizona University. Nesbitt joined the NAU athletic staff as head trainer last year. Before coming to NAU he was head trainer at Southwest Minnesota State College. Nesbitt, a graduate of Page High School, received his B.A. degree at Idaho State College where he served as student assistant. He then went to graduate school at Indiana State, earning his M.A. in physical education and athletic training and was graduate assistant under Mel Bickens-staff.

SOUTH ALL STAR TRAINER -- Warren H. Lee, head trainer at the University of Arizona. He joined the athletic staff as assistant trainer at the U of A in 1968 and took over as head trainer in 1970. Before moving to the U of A, Lee was assistant trainer at the University of New Mexico for three years. Two years prior to that he was head trainer at Pueblo High School in Tucson. He is a graduate of Pacific Lutheran, and earned his M.A. at the U of A. He is a native of Williston, N. Dak.

With each passing year the basketball and football talent at the high school level in Arizona just keeps on improving and out-of-state college coaches come from greater distances to recruit this talent.

Arizona's high school baseball, track and field, golf, tennis, and swimming are among the best in the nation and many have proven themselves at the national level in these sports.

On May 24 this year the South Basketball All-Stars nipped the North 84-82 at

Brophy Prep in Phoenix to run their string to four in a row.

The South will be shooting for a third straight win today. Last year the South nipped the North 21-20 and the previous year the South won 41-25 in the highest scoring game of the series.

Since the games were re-organized into a North-South arrangement in 1962, the North leads the football series 5-3 and the South leads the basketball war 6-3.

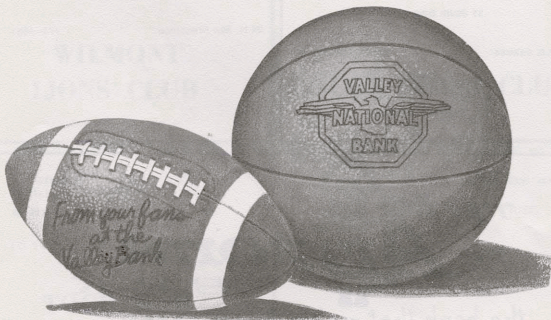

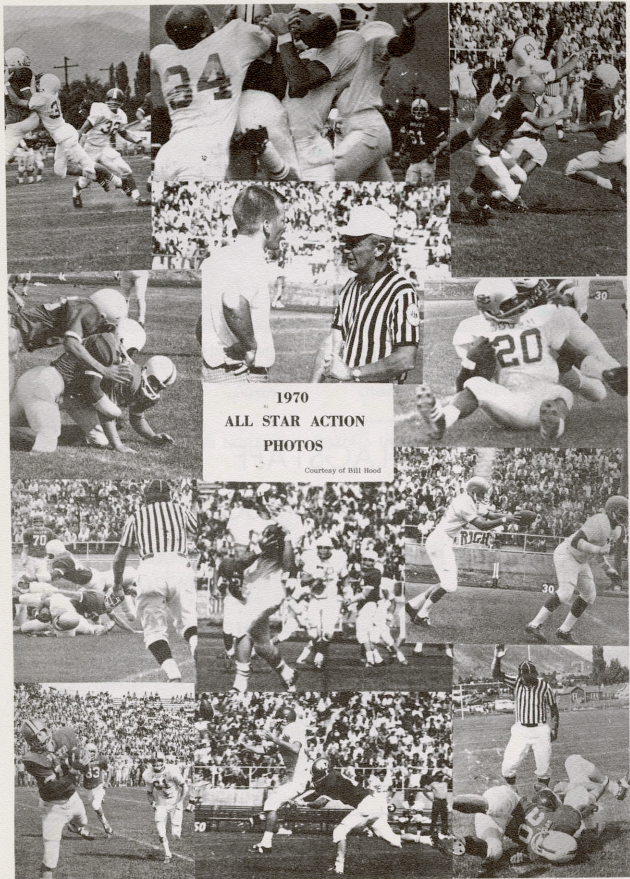

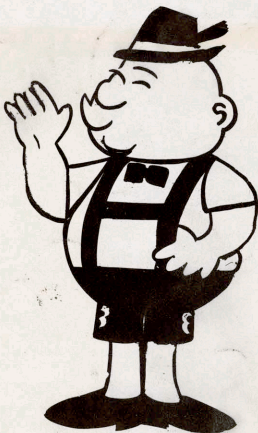
The game was close all the way with the North leading 20-18 at the end of the first quarter and it was 40-all at the half. The North lead 63-58 starting the final quarter.
