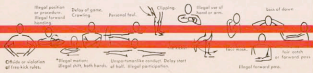

## ARIZONA FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME CODE

Beginning in 1970 there will be established the "ARIZONA FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME".

1. **PURPOSE:** To honor those high school, college, Pro football players, football coaches, administrators and officials, who have exhibited outstanding accomplishment in and service to football, and during the subsequent years have reflected honor upon themselves and football.
2. **ELIGIBILITY:** Any outstanding high school, college, Pro football player, football coach, administrator or official from Arizona is eligible.
3. Announcement of awards will be made at the annual Arizona Football Hall of Fame Awards Banquet to be held in Phoenix.
4. Nominations may be turned in to any member of the Nominating Council.
5. Final selection will be made by the Arizona Football Hall of Fame Executive Board.
