

#### POP WARNER FOOTBALL IN FLAGSTAFF

Last fall, Pop Warner football came to Flagstaff and more than 100 youngsters ages 9-13 were divided into six teams — two leagues of three teams each.

These young football players displayed their talents in one massive group, then coaches "drafted" their teams, just like the professional teams do, from this pool of talent. Then practice began. Before any contact was allowed, these youngsters had to go through 20 hours of non-contact drills which consisted of conditioning, fundamentals and learning the basics of the came.

Youngsters participating in the Junior Midget Division had to fall between 11-13 years of age and weigh between 80-100 pounds while those in the Pee Wee Division had to be 9-12 years of age and weigh 60-80 pounds. No "special" methods are permitted for a player to lose weight as any weight loss must come through conditioning.

This was these young players first taste of "tackle" football and just one injury was sustained during the entire season and that was the aggrivation of an old injury. A doctor was on hand at every game and no one was injured under game play.

Hopefully, next year there will be 1-2 "expansion" teams in each of the two divisions. A Youngster participated this past year for a 56 registration fee plus the purchase of his own shoes, mouth piece and supporter --- otherwise, all of equipment was provided by the Flagstaff Youth Association, soonsors of Pow Warner footblall in Flagstaff.

#### TODAY'S GAME

This will be the second meeting of football teams from Northern Arizona University and Boise State College and if it's anything like the first one last yeat — it should be a dandy one.

The Boise Broncos beat NAU 22-17 last year on the strength of five field goals by Eric Guthrie and a return of an intercepted pass. Those five field goals in one game are not only a Big Sky Conference record, they're the lone national record currently held by a Big Sky player!

Last year when the Lumberjacks traveled to Boise, the Broncos were building a strong foundation for their later-to-come appearance in the Camellia Bowl in which they best Chico State, 32-28.

Boise lost its bid for the Big Sky title last year by losing to Idaho State University, 21-17 in the next-to-last game of the season. So, when Idaho State had a chance to win the conference title this fall, Boise naturally returned the favor and beat the Idaho State Bengals, 31-28, last weekend!

Last week. NAU was in Howait to meet the touted Rainbows and the Lumberjack players had football on their minds – something at lot teams going to Howait don't have when kickoff rolls around. Although Hewaii wom the girne, 2013, the Rainbows know they were in a 80minute context. NAU led 76 until the final 157 of the first haif and in about 151 and 151

Once again, running back Tom Rogers played an outstanding game as he gained 108 yards rushing. Fullback Milford Suida also played a fine game and did a yeoman's job of blocking and gained 75 yards himself.

Rogers has now picked up 665 yards rushing on the season and has now become the top rusher at NAU since the Lumberjacks entered the Big Sky Conference three years ago, surpassing the 620 gained by Danny white last year. He is 221 yards away from breaking the one-year high of 885 yards set by Jim Sims in 1964.

Once again, linebacker Joe Hernandez did a yeoman's job. He got able assistance from fellow linebacker Vic Boniolo.

POWER INDEX: Going into the final full week of the season, NAU's 11 opponents hold a 60-40 won-loss record and just one time during the course of the season, these opponents fell below the .500 level, just oncel And just three of the 11 teams having losing seasons.

Of those 40 losses, 16 have been by a touchdown or less and on eight of the occasions the losses were so close that a field goal would have won or tied the game. So, with a little luck, NAU's opponents could have a 76-24 mark.

AFTER THE FACT: During a pre-season poll of Big Sky coaches and RS Sports Information Directors, the University of Idaho was a near unainable pick to repeat as Big Sky chainp this fall and drew 134 of a possible point in the poll while Montana State derve 18 points and was a near unainable possible for the RS sports and the RS sports and the RS sports and RS sport



#### INSIDE BOISE STATE COLLEGE

Boise State became a state institution of higher education January 1, 1969 and holds accreditation from the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools. Boise State's enrollment for the fall semester 1971 was. 9.383 students.

The explosive growth of the school necessitated the design and implementation of a \$12,000,000 building program to provide classroom, recreational and living quarters for students. New buildings on campus under this construction program include the Business Administration Building, Vocational-Technical Building, Bronco Stadium with Astro Turl playing field, Physical Education Building and awimming pool, campus lighting, heating plant expansion, Administration Building remodeling, Towers Women's Residence Hall, College Union expansion, parking lot and Library Learning Center.

Boise State has four schools of undergraduate instruction and a graduate school. The College consists of a School of Business, School of Education, School of Arts and Sciences, an area Vocational-Technical Division and the Graduate School. Boise State offers bachelor degrees in 40 academic areas and gives one- and two-year certificates in ten fields.

Masters degrees are offered in elementary education and business administration.

Boise State is a comprehensive state college, serving the needs of the State of Idaho. A new public television station, KAID went on the air in January, 1972.

Young in spirit and practice, Boise State holds strongly to the need to be innovative, pioneering and flexible as it seeks to meet the complex needs of Idaho.

NAU and Boise both entered the Big Sky Conference at the same time on July 1, 1970 and both have participated as full members of the conference since then.

In head-to-head athletic combat between the two schools, NAU has won six of nine events. The two schools have split four basketball games, NAU has won all four base-ball games and in the first football meeting last fall, Boise beat NAU 22-17. Last year Boise beat Chico State of California, 32-28, in the Camellia Bowl in Sacramento.




