#### 1974 NAU FOOTBALL OUTLOOK

GENERAL OUTLOOK: "We should be improved, but we still lack depth at many spots," commented Ed Peasley who is in his fourth year as head football coach at NAU. "Our opponents will also be improved and we once again play a rugged schedule as six of our foes were nationally ranked last year."

"I am extremely pleased with the cohesive unit our assistant coaches have formed and their ability to teach and expand our offense and defensive styles of play —— they've zeroed in on specifics extremely well."

OFFENSIVE OUTLOOK: "We return four of the six starters on the offensive line in tight end Kenny Allen, tackle Gil Ramos, center Terry Hoerner and guard Bill Rudolph and the caliber of people they've played against gives us a strong nucleus here," said line coach Scott Schuhmann.

Alan Warzecha, a reserve a year ago, gives NAU a solid swing man at the guard and tackle spots plus newcomers Charles Brunk and Gilbert Huerta will help with the depth at the guard spots. Perhaps the strongest spot on the team is tight end with Allen returning along with newcomers Bob Tagye and Paul Berlin.

"The offensive backfield will have good depth at fullback in letterman Jerry Wallace and newcomer Gary Charlon while the tailback spot will have good outside speed with Brad Boyse and Eric Days, said offensive back coach Mike Churchill. Dave Mendez' return at quarterback plus the impressive spring Bandy Berry had gives us a lot of hope. Berry made great improvement and only

needs experience and playing time to develop even further. His great winning tradition and attitude are plusses."

Churchill was pleased with the progress the passing game made in the spring and Rocky Loyce and Rich Carlberg, the two returning wide receivers, did a good job of catching the ball and they made giant strides in improving their blocking. Dennis Dixon, a newcomer with 4.5 speed in the 40-yard dash, could replace either of the two if they let up. Another newcomer, Kevin Riley, appears to have sewed up the split end spot.

ANALYSIS: NAU made a lot of progress toward coming up with a balanced attack and if as much improvement is made in fall practice, NAU's foes will find it hard to key on either the run or pass.

NAU's long-range building program is starting to show up as the entire offensive unit has just 2-3 key seniors and actually, a lineup of all sophomores and juniors could be put on the field at any one time.

DEFENSIVE OUTLOOK: "With the change to an odd man front on defense, our players had to learn new techniques and coverage assignments," said defensive back coach Al Worley. "The players ended spring drills with a better understanding of what is expected of them as far as our new system goes."

NAU returns three veteran linebackers in Willie Pringle, Mark Snyder and Billy Wagner. Also coming back are Charlie Gover and redshirt Paul Edge, so NAU's linebacker play should be solid.

Of the nine defensive down linemen, Bruce Ivor, George Kagele, Bob James and Jerry Grigsby are all well experienced. Newcomers Zephery Eckenzie and Bill Palmer will add some solid football savvy and Todd John, Rich Terry and Chris Minor all switched from offense to defensive ends and Minor earned a starting job at one end spot. Ivor, Kagele, James and Grigsby are all Arizona high school products, as are Terry and John.

The defensive backs appear to be the weakest spot on the team with just two vets coming back in Randy Spilsbury and Chuck Apt.

Junior college transfer Doug Schriner should help as should Paul Arslanian, who saw limited action last year due to injury and Jim Deering, who switched from wide receiver to defensive back in the spring.

AMALYSIS: NAU got solid play from the defensive front and its linebackers during spring drills; however, more depth and talent will be needed at the defensive back spots.
