
Northern Arizona University vs Weber State College



TODAY'S GAME

If somebody had come tup to me about four weeks ago and told me that there was a possibility that Weber State College might give the up and coming NAU Lumberjacks a tough game here in Lumberjack Stadium on Nov. 13, I would not have believed it.

After all, last season they won only one game and four weeks ago, they were 0-6 in the win-loss column. They were getting beat by everybody and their sister. . . and badly at that. After getting thumped by Idaho 45-17, Wildcat Head Coach Dick Gwinn announced that he would resign effective, in January. Talk about your bad situations, this was it.

But something has happened to the Wildcats. They have won two out of their last three games. The week after Gwinn's announcement WSC defeated pre-season conference favorite Idaho State, 34-7. Last week they plastered South Dakota State University 52-19. These are not the same Wildcats that were 0-6 four weeks ago who come into Lumberjack Stadium today. Suddenly things aren't so funny.

There is little doubt that the NAU "Diaper Defense," which was mauled last week up in Bozeman, Montana, will have to contain senior quarterback Rod Bockwoldt (19), who has been virtually a one man gang for the Wildcats this year. Bockwoldt is currently leading the Big Sky Conference in total offense averaging close to 200 yards per game. He is also the conference's leading passer having thrown for over 1700 yards and 11 touchdowns. The Weber signal caller is a threat to run too as he has scored seven touchdowns on the ground and owns his teams' longest run from scrimmage-60 yards. It is no real big secret. As Bockwoldt goes, so go the Wildcats.

Defensively, the two teams have one thing in common. ...youth. Only two seniors start for Weber but they are quality performers. Lorenzo Townsend (78) is one of the top tacklers on the team and cornerback Orin Trussell (26) is one of the tops in the conference at his position. Soph Doug Battershill (46) is a fixture at strong safety.

As far as the Lumberjacks are concerned, they are now 6-2 and fighting for a second place finish in the conference race. They return home from Montana State after taking a 33-0 beating at the hands of the newly crowned champs. It was just a simple fact that the luck that had ridden with the Lumberjacks most of the season ran out. NAU could do no right last Saturday and MSU could do no wrong.

However, in light of recent years, a second place finish and a winning record would be nothing to sneeze at. If Joe Salem's crew can win their last three games, they will have the best record the school has seen since 1958 when the 'Jacks went 11-1. But it will not be easy. It will begin today with Weber State who has come a long way in the last few weeks. They must win today and again next week in Moscow, Idaho if they wish to be the "Avis" of the Big Sky conference.

This young football team has shown that they are capable of handling the task before them. They are not quitters and they are now dedicated to winning, something I think NAU fans will see for many years to come.

GAME NOTES: Bockwoldt was the Wildcats' leading receiver for two years before being switched to quarterback late last season.

If the two offenses sputter, watch for a duel for the Big Sky's punting championship between NAU's Bob Martin and WSC's Mike Korvas, who are

standing 1-2 respectively in the conference.

With the opening of the 1977 football season slated to take place in the Ensphere, this is the final game that will be played in Lumberjack Stadium. The stadium has been up since 1947 and it has seen a lot of re-modeling, players, games
