

TODAY'S GAME



In this week's game against the University of Nevada at Las Vegas, the 'Jacks may be facing their most crucial test of the season to date.

After a disappointing, but hard fought, 9-7 loss to Cal Poly-Pomona last weekend, the Axers need to regain that winning momentum and confidence that sustained them so well through the first four games.

But the Rebels of Las Vegas are not the type of team that will give anyone an easy win. In fact, the Rebels now support a 5-1 season and have beaten many of the same teams NAU has and is nationally ranked among the nation's NCAA Division II schools.

NAU downed Montana, 23-21 while the Rebels edged the Grizzlies, 21-19. NAU beat Idaho State, 34-7 and the Rebels downed the Bengals, 31-17. Another common foe was the University of Nebraska at Omaha. NAU beat the Mavericks, 28-13 and the Rebels did the same, 63-42.

Clearly, then, the faceoff between the Lumberjacks and the Rebels should be an evenly matched contest.

Although today's game is a non-conference outing for the 'Jacks, the fact that Boise State, Montana State, Weber State and Idaho lay wait for the 'Jacks in the next four weeks make this game all the more important.

This is a bounce-back game for NAU. The trademark of a good football team is not its ability to go undefeated. The character of a team is measured in its ability to gel when luck turns for the worse. The Axers, I believe, have that quality to bounce back.

Saw Dust: Tony Knapp is no stranger to Lumberjack Stadium as he twice led Boise State teams into Flagstaff, winning 45-13 in 1974 and 39-12 in 1972. Last season Knapp's Boise State team beat NAU 48-0 and just missed making a two-point conversion on the tail end of the contest, or the game would have been 50-01

UNLV leads the series with NAU, 3-1. Last season UNLV beat the Axers in Las Vegas, 34-21. Other NAU-UNLV scores have been: UNLV winning 42-14 in 1973 and 31-14 in 1974. NAU won 20-7 in the snow in 1971, in Flagstaff.

Henry Vereen (34), UNLV's dashing kick returner continues to lead the nation's Division II schools in kickoff returns with a 35.7 average. Rebel quarterback Glenn Carano (12) has hit on 84 of 156 passes for 1,130 yards and sid TD's.


