

# **TODAY'S GAMÉ**

With a few less injuries and a few breaks, Boise State would be bringing a 7-0 record into today's Mom and Dad's Day contest at Northern Arizona University; however, the perennial Big Sky Conference champions have had some bad breaks and their record reads 3-3-1 at gametime; however, with all of their tough luck, the three defeats add up to a scant 14 points!

So, those thinking the Broncos are not nearly as tough as in the past, don't think that way! New head coach Jim Criner has made several changes in the Bronco attack both offensively and defensively.

Past Boise State teams have had a wide-open passing attack and Criner has installed a more balanced attack and the Broncos come into the game averaging 181.4 yards rushing and 191.4 passing.

Defensively, the Broncos use the "52" front which features three down linemen and four linebackers and is similar to the 4-3 front.

NAU has never defeated the Broncos in five previous tries and last year Boise handed the Lumberjacks their worst defeat in the series, 48-0. In two previous trips to Flagstaff, Boise won 39-12 in 1972 and 45-13 in 1974.

Boise is led by sophomore quarterback Dee Pickett (11) who has led the Big Sky in individual total offense with 186 yards a game, but he was injured last week in the Broncos' 26-8 win over Nevada-Reno and if he's unable to play, the Boise attack will be led by Greg Stern (18), who simply led the Broncos to their third Big Sky title last fall!

Fred Goode (40) is Boise's top rusher with 419 yards and he's also the leading receiver with 24 catches for 194 yards. Mitch Britzman (38) has picked up 325 yards on the ground.

Other top receivers include Terry Hutt (80) who has caught 23 for 434 yards and two scores while Mike Holton (20) has caught 20 for 338 yards and one TD.

Defensively, Gary Rosolowich (23) is a dangerous man with either punt or kickoff returns and he's a dandy pass defender as he led the conference with 11 interceptions a year ago. Last week Rosolowich returned a kickoff 93 yards for a TD.

Boise is among the top defensive teams in the Big Sky as the Broncos have given up 189.4 yards a game on the ground and 131 passing.

GAME NOTES: Boise State has been in every game it has played this fall and the Broncos have experienced their share of hard luck this fall.

NAU and Boise both joined the Big Sky in 1970 and the Broncos have had the most success in the conference in football since then. Over the past four years, including this fall, Boise has a 17-3-1 conference mark.
