





Boise State University's 110 acre campus with many modern buildings is located along the Boise River green belt and pedestrian mall. A footbridge connecting it with beautiful Julia Davis Park, just across the river, adds to the attractiveness of the

Founded in 1932 as a private community college, BSU grew steadily through the depression and war years. Idaho's legislature accorded fouryear status to Boise College in 1965, then approved its entry into the state university system in 1974 as Boise State University. Today BSU's student enrollment is the largest in Idaho

The Eagle has traditionally symbolized pride and excellence. That is why we bear the Eagle as our symbol and are happy to award the Golden Eagle to those student athletes who perform with pride and excellence.

Peggy Kennedy was selected as the first woman athlete to receive the GOLDEN EAGLE AWARD because, while maintaining a Deans' List academic standing, she was the first athlete to bring outside recognition of Northern Arizona University women's athletics, in recent

history.

Miss Kennedy, a 5-8 two-year veteran of the Lumberjill basket-ball team, would be more appropriately middle-named "First." The name would, at least, be indicative of her athlatic career at NAU where she has re-written many of her own records.

Last May, she was one of the ten best women university athletes in Arzona, and the only basketball player, honored at a banquet sponsored by The Arizona Republic. She was the first NAU athlete to be so honored.

Earlier in the year, Miss Kennedy became the school's first player named to an All intermountain Conference team, although as a freshman she had been the first to earn honorable mantion.

The highly enthusiastic guard finished the 1977-78 season third in overall conference scoring with a 19.8 average, upping that of her freshman year when she was ranked fifth with an 18.5 average



and became the first NAU player listed in the conferences top ten players.

Additionally, she was the conference's eighth leading rebounder, averaging 10.1, and was second in free throw percentage at 81.3, having hit 39 of 48 attempts. During her first year at NAU, Miss Kennedy was ninth in conference rebouding.

Her single-game high scoring has also put her among the toOp conference players. She chalked up 30 points against University of Arizona as a freshman and last year scored 29 against both UA and University of Texas-El Paso. Miss Konnetty also holds the

Miss Kennedy also holds the NAU records for the most points scored in a season, 356 in 1977-78, and in a career, 671. She leads in season and career rebounding. 227 and 427, respectively, and in season and career steals and assists

Her performances have earned her recognition at NAU as the first and second recipient of the Lumberjill Award, an honor presented to the school's outstanding female athlete in any sport.

A member of Delta Delta Delta Delta national social sorority. Miss Kennedy is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Kennedy of Schaumburg, Illi, who have come west each year to see her fally for NAU. She attended Western Illinois State University before coming to NAU and is expected to graduate in May with a bachelor of science degree in recreation.

LUMBERJACK LEGENDS

LUMBERJACKS

Harold P. Blome writes: "I first attended NANS in 1909 at which time we had three saw mills. On the Fourth of July we had celebrations on ground which is now on or about your football field. The events included bronco riding by local cowboys and sawing logs against time by men who worked in called Lumber Jacks. It was phenomenal how fast the two Lumber Jacks cut a big log in two... (From this) the athletic teams adopted the name of Lumber Jacks ... " Mr. Blome is the younger son of R. H. H. Blome, second president of Northern Arizona Normal School (NAU). His letter was written in July.

WHEELS

The Lumberjack Wheels first became a part of Lumberjack homecoming and NAU tradition in 1932 when they were used by the Industrial Arts Club as a "float." In 1934, they were used to carry the king and queen, Chester Fuller and Helen Gibbons, the annual homecoming parade has been broken only a few times, never in recent years.

COPPER AXE

It was but nine months after NAU students received their pure Arizona copper axe in Feb., 1933, that it was stolen. The axe had been constructed to the specifications set by

"Lumberjack" in raised letters. Deputy sheriff Jim Gregg and NAU night watchman J.E. Donnell captured the thieves after a 30-mile chase and

returned them and the axe to Flagstaff. The theives, who turned out to be six Arizona State University freshmen football players, told officials they had

Rhodes Neece, Paul Guthrie, James Jiacoletti, Howard Hooten, Howard Wynn and Albert Dalmolin. School and police officials termed the incident "a prank,"



Meteor Crater - the world's best preserved and first proven meteorite crater - is 4,150 feet from rim to rim. three miles in circumference and 570 feet deep. Such man-made wonders as the Washington Monument and the massive Great Pyramids of Egypt are dwarfed by its giant dimensions.
