# **IDAHO STATE UNIVERSITY**

Idaho State University originated in 1902 as the Academy of Idaho, a two-year school offering college preparatory and industrial courses. 70

In 1915 the academy was renamed the Idaho Technical Institute and given a twofold functionvocational trade school and a junior college with emphasis on occupational courses. Enrollment was 500 in 1917 when the U.S. entered World War I.

The school's name was changed again in 1927. this time to Southern Branch of the University of Idaho with a resultant stress of the cultural and deemphasis of the technical and vocational

Idaho State College was established in 1947 by the 29th session of the state legislature as an independent, four-year, degree-granting institution. Divisions included a College of Liberal Arts. College of Pharmacy, and School of Trade and Industrial Education, A graduate division, offering degrees of Master of Arts in Education, Master of Science in Education, and Master of Education, was 1957.

In 1963, the 37th Idaho State Legislature approved another name change-to Idaho State

Tee Ward, a senior business major from Ft. Thomas. Arizona, would almost feel at home at any of the six interior offensive line spots. In fact, he's played them all—center, both guards, both tackles and tight end.

"Tee came to NAU as a tight end," says offensive line coad. Andy Brennan. But, when we had depth problems starting last spring, we asked him to play where ever we needed him and he responded with a smile on his face."

Before coming to NAU, Tee played at Eastern Arizona college where he caught 30 passes for 478 yards during the 1938 season. The 6-5, 235-pound Ward is the back-up left offensive guard as of this writing—but that's subject to change.




