- 2. The construction of a new, modern, up-to-date training school.
- 3. Conversion of the present training school into a science and vocational arts building.
- 4. The possible construction of a president's home with the conversion of the present home into a music conservatory and home economics practice house.
- 5. Construction of a women's outdoor recreation field.
- 6. Paving of campus streets.
- 7. Improvement of campus—especially that portion back of the training school and new library.
- 8. Several additional faculty members.
