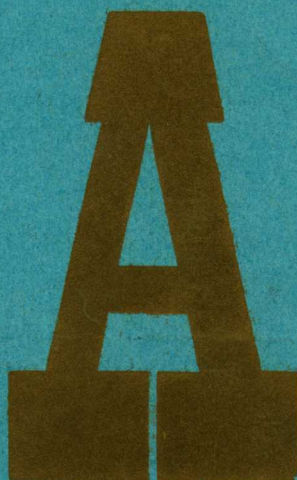

The Alumni Association is helping to purchase band uniforms. In addition to these improvements many smaller items have been carried to completion.

Our faculty has been growing stronger year by year. This has been brought about by their securing additional training and by additions of new people. Our curricula have been expanded in many ways. All in all, we feel we are making some progress.

As we survey the future we see the following needs:

1. Construction of additional dormitory space.
2. The construction of a new, modern, up-to-date training school.
3. Conversion of the present training school into a science and vocational arts building.
4. The possible construction of a president's home with the conversion of the present home into a music conservatory and home economics practice house.
5. Construction of a women's outdoor recreation field.
6. Paving of campus streets.
7. Improvement of campus—especially that portion back of the training school and new library.
8. Several additional faculty members.

There are many other items too numerous to mention. You see we need your help in the building of a larger and finer A. S. T. C.
